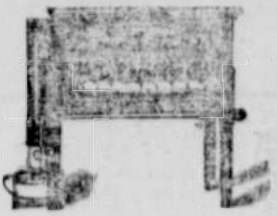

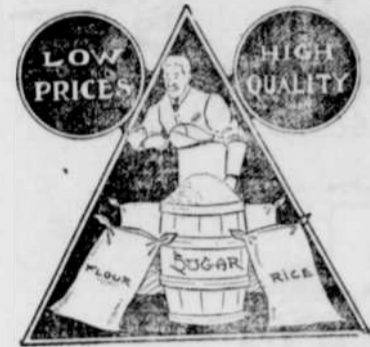

The country newspaper is successful in proportion to the initiative of the editor. He is one of the most vital forces in the community in promoting its social and commercial prosperity. An instance of how this initiative can be made effective is given in Fabrica, Fancy Goods and notions, which says: "An agreement was reached in a western town (presumably through the influence of the local newspaper) between all the merchants whereby they offered special sales on certain days, each merchant selecting some special line of goods upon which he made a lower price than usual. Thus one dry-goods house would sell gloves at a special price, while another would offer bargains in dress goods. One hardware merchant would reduce the price on skates. Every line of business was represented, and care was taken that no conflicts occurred. Prizes were then offered to the farmer bringing in the best load of grain, the finest lot of hogs or cattle, coming the longest distance, etc., and the bargain day was extensively advertised in the surrounding country, the names of the merchants and their special sales being in all cases stated. The farmers responded in a most gratifying manner, and the merchants were well pleased with the plan. The idea has already been carried out in several cities.

**Facts of Production Wanted.**  
J. R. Shepard, the corresponding secretary of the Willamette Valley development league, is engaged in the collection of a thousand facts about the products of the eight counties of the valley. These 1000 statements are to be made in each case by the producer himself, so much per acre, of such a product sold for such a price. This region can be made to show the greatest variety of products and the richest yield of any part of the world. Each county is allowed to have 25 statements in the collection, and at least 100,000 copies of these statements are to be circulated in the east in the next sixty days, before the next edition rates are put into effect in March. These statements coming from the producers themselves, and coming from each of the eight counties, will result in the location of at least 50,000 homeseekers in our valley in the next year. Send your statement of a big crop, or yield of fruit or wool clip or profits from horses, etc. to J. R. Shepard, at Salem, or hand them in to this office and we will forward the same to him. This section of the state cannot be surpassed in this line of information, and we want a good representation in the collection of facts for advertising the most productive region in the world.
