### BIG WOODMAN MEETING.

#### Polk County Camps Get Together for Spring Campaign.

On Tuesday evening the large Woodman hall at Dallas was comfortably filled with an enthusiastic band of Choppers who had gathered for the purpose of inaugurating a three months campaign in Polk county for the acquiring of new members, and to conclude with a mammoth initiation and picnic. State Organizer Harry Day, of Portland, at whose solicitation the work was started, was present, and in a neat speech outlined the plan of campaign. Delegates from many of the camps of the county were present, and all united in taking up his suggestions with enthusiasm. A half hour's recess was taken from the regular work and the several committees organized into one of the whole by the election of Hon. W. L. Toole, of Falls City, as chairman; School Superintendent H. C. Seymour, of Dallas, as secretary, and Mr. W. W. Dawson, of Dallas, as treasurer. These three officials being also named as the executive committee for the campaign, in conjunction with State Organizer Day and Special Organizer Fiske, of the Polk County Itemizer. By a unanimous vote of the committee it was decided to hold the initiation on Friday, the 22nd day of May, and the picnic on the following day, the place selected being the beautiful and hospitable town of Falls City, which is now making such a record growth in population and business requirements. The following prizes were offered: To the camp making the largest gain in new members, pro rata with its present membership, a handsome flag will be given as a first prize, and to the next camp a handsome silver mounted set of working tools. The Woodman who brings in seven new applications will get a handsome solid gold ring of large value. Two applications will secure a handsome watch fob. The largest number of applications brought in by any member will earn a large and beautiful solid gold badge. Two prizes will be awarded to the ladies who get the most applications, a first and second. These prizes have not as yet been fully decided upon, but they will be articles of value to any well working for.

A unique plan of enticing the membership was devised and will be carried out for the benefit of the campaign and the several camps. It is for, at some time during the campaign, each camp in the county to entertain the committees from all the other camps and other visiting Woodmen. At this meeting only two of these dates were definitely set, but the others will be announced in due time. On February 2nd the Ballston camp will do the entertainment act and have great assistance in the race for new timber, and on March 3rd all will meet at Dallas for a repetition of the good work.

The meeting closed with a fine and plentiful banquet laid by those popular caterers, the Johnson Brothers, and after a good smoke and delightful social intercourse the big meeting adjourned, all firm in the conviction that from now on until the 25th of May things will be humming in Woodman circles.

#### COUNCIL MEETING.

#### City Dads Hold Regular Session Monday.

The city council met in regular session last Monday evening with all the officers present except Councilmen Shaw and Straffin. Councilman VanOrdel, of the committee on Fire and Water, recommended the placing of electric lights at the railroad crossing near the Dunick residence, in Germantown, at the intersection of Ash street and the intersection of East Dallas, at the intersection of Ellis and Birch streets and the intersection of Ash and Church streets. These lights are to be 32-candle power, and are to cost the city \$1.50 a month each. The railroad companies were ordered notified of new crosswalks needed on several streets.

The city marshal was ordered to move the Ullrey sidewalk on Ash street to conform to the line as laid down in the city plat.

Claims allowed: E. V. Dalton, laborer, \$1.12; V. P. Fearing, printing, 10.54; Oscar Hayter, salary, 20.00. No remonstrations appearing to the contrary, the city engineer was ordered to construct a cement walk in front of the ice plant and no bids for its construction having been received, the city marshal was ordered to go ahead and have it built.

The street commissioner was given power to act in the matter of graveling the Steuffer hill.

On motion the city attorney was ordered to draft an ordinance prohibiting boys under 18 years of age from frequenting pool rooms and to increase the license fee of such pool rooms to from \$12 to \$20 a year for the first table, \$15 for the second and \$10 for each additional table.

The street commissioner was ordered to tear up and re-construct the Eugene Fryer sidewalk.

The old chairs in the city hall were ordered sold at 25 cents each.

The city attorney was instructed to draft an ordinance making all streets 40 feet wide between park strips, excepting the three business blocks east and west of Main street.

The city auditor was ordered to notify property owners on business section that the council intends mandating these certain streets.

Adjourned.

#### CITY NEWS.

Dr. L. L. Rowland, who was at one time president of the Month-month normal, died at Mehama recently.

A crowded house greeted the Dazzy lecture at the Woodman hall Friday evening, and there was not a dissatisfied one in the house.

Deputy Sheriff Minto, who has had direct charge of the case, states that some days ago a message was received from the authorities at Tacoma stating that a man answering the description of the man wanted in Salem was under arrest there. A complete description of the suspect was at once sent to Tacoma and a wire has been received from the chief police at Tacoma to the effect that there is no doubt that they have the man wanted.—Salem Journal.

#### The dance at Ricketts Friday night was a decided success.

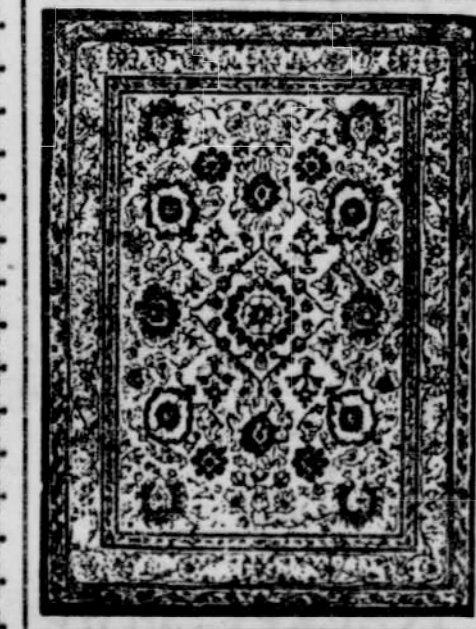
The Polk County poultry association will meet at the court house next Saturday. They intend the holding of regular meetings for the purpose of stimulating their industry.
