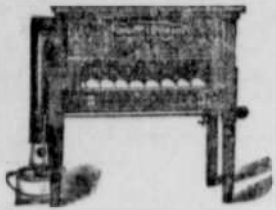

NEW RULING.

Department Says Subscribers Delinquent Over One Year Must be Dropped.

The postoffice officials, at Washington, have seen fit to decree as to whether or no a newspaper may give credit to its subscribers, and have fixed the limit of indebtedness at one year. If after April 1st any subscribers are found on a weekly newspaper's list who are more than one year in arrears they must be dropped or their papers refused admittance to the mail at pound rates. This will necessitate the eliminating of them from the list, as no publisher can afford to affix a 1-cent stamp to each paper. We consider this an arbitrary ruling and a hardship on country publishers, but there is no way of getting around it—we have to use the mails. Many of our subscribers prefer to pay several years at a time and they will, under the new law, have to pay ahead instead of letting the matter run several years before liquidating. Those who want the Itemizer then, after April 1st will have to pay up before that time or be dropped from the list, and they will be charged up with the amount due at that time. Since owning the paper we have not dunned any of our delinquents, but we are now sending out statements, and hope that all will come in and settle up as soon as possible, so that we may start with a clean sheet and comply with the law.

For the benefit of those concerned we give the ruling of the department:

Sec. 446, paragraph 4: "A reasonable time will be allowed publishers to secure renewals of subscriptions, but unless subscriptions are expressly renewed after the term for which they are paid within the following periods—fifteen months, semi-weeklies within six months, weekly newspapers within nine months and weeklies within one year—they shall not be counted in the legitimate list of subscribers, and copies mailed on account thereof shall not be accepted for mailing at the second class postage rate of 1 cent a pound, but may be mailed at the transient second class postage of 1 cent for each four ounces or fraction thereof, repaid by stamps affixed. The right of a publisher to extend credit on subscriptions to his publication is not denied or questioned, but his compliance or non-compliance with this registration will be taken into consideration in determining whether the publication is entitled to transmission at the second class postage rates."

MR. BRYAN'S OPINIONS.

The plan of guaranteed bank deposits has probably found favor, among all classes of people and irrespective of political affiliation, more rapidly than any other public question. The new state of Oklahoma has already enacted a law taxing state banks, ready to be put into effect in the near future. The purpose of enacting legislation similar to the Oklahoma plan. The governor of Nebraska is considering the advisability of calling a special session of the legislature on account of the growing belief among the people that protection to bank depositors in the form of state or federal guarantees of their deposits will stop the hoarding of money, bring into circulation sufficient currency to conduct the business of the country, and prevent a recurrence of such disastrous panics as the one through which we are now passing.

Mr. Bryan has been an advocate of a law guaranteeing deposits in state and national banks since 1893. The legislature of Ohio has adopted a joint resolution inviting Mr. Bryan to address its members in joint session February 18, 1908, on the subject of Guaranteed Bank Deposits. Mr. Bryan, in discussing the tariff question, insists that residents of the United States should be permitted to buy home-made goods at home at as low a price as the foreigner can buy American-made goods abroad. He also insists that our government should be by and for the people as a whole, rather than by and for the trusts, and administrators of the trust system. He believes that national legislation for the purpose of better regulation and control of interstate commerce and common carriers should supplement state legislation, and not be a substitute for state legislation.
