AN OLD RECORD.

Harry Hollister Digs Up an Old Document.

Some time ago Mr. J. H. Hollister moved into what is known as the Wells residence in East Dallas. In cleaning up Mr. and Mrs. Hollister ran across an old record of the justice court in an early day in Polk county, that now makes interesting reading.

The first docket entry is that in which Andrew Honeey is plaintiff against Isaac Smith and Adam Brown as directors of school district No. 7, in which the plaintiff sues to recover \$79 as back salary for services rendered as teacher.

In 1868 with J. L. Collins as justice the time of the court was taken up for several days, by the non-arrival of the defendant's witnesses, in a case where Chas. Sulton is charged with burglary

at Independence. Sulton was apprehended by J. J. Murphy, then sheriff of Marion county and as it appeared to the justice that there was no officer in Polk to take charge of him, he was remanded to the custody of Constable T. J. Lovelady, who furnished the court a receipt for his appearance at the proper time and place.

Here we are compelled by lack of time to cease the perusal of this interesting old time docket, but may take it up at some other time and probably run into something out of the general order in old time reminiscences.
