A Wrong Impression. The impression seems to have gone out that the pioneers had to pay 25 cents each for their banquet here on Pioneer day. This is not correct. The banquet was paid for out of the funds raised by the carnival committee and volunteer subscriptions of eatables. The 25 cents paid by the pioneers is their annual dues to the society.

Still Another Injunction. Judge Gallogay Monday evening granted a temporary injunction restraining the county judge of Polk county from declaring the town of Independence. However it seems that the county court had already filed its order to that effect. The matter will come up for a hearing and argument before the court on next Thursday by stipulation between the attorneys interested. Facts upon which the saloon men of Independence base their action are these: The charter of that city was amended by the legislature in 1905 and gave that municipality complete control over the matter of licensing saloons and similar matters. The local option law passed in 1904, and the argument is that the action of the legislature in 1905 repealed that of 1904, insofar as independence is concerned. The case is identical with the one from Medford, where a similar injunction was granted. Carson & Brown are retained by the saloon men, while District Attorney McNary will represent Polk county.
