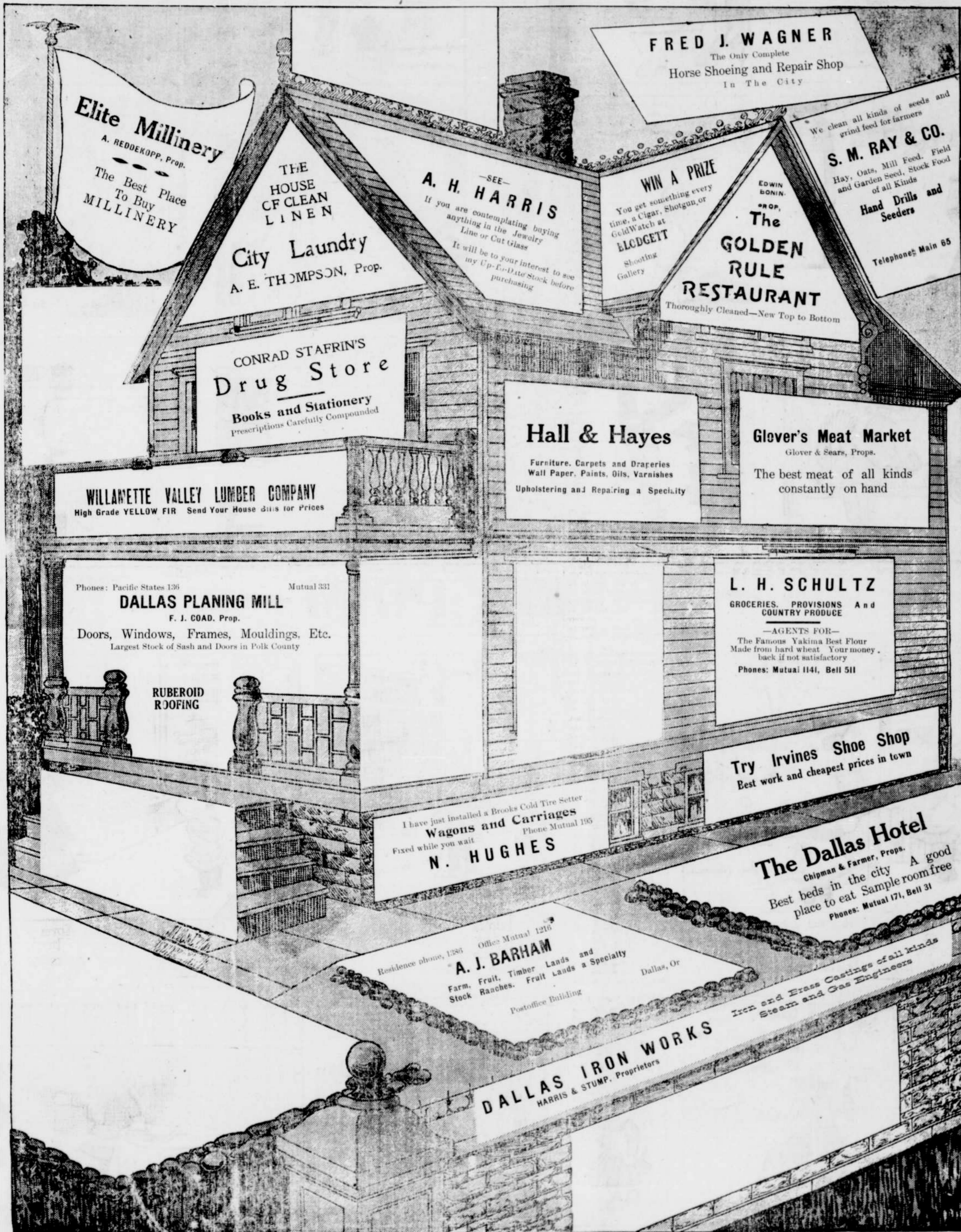

New Temporary Schoolhouse.

At a meeting Tuesday night of the board of directors of school district 2, it was decided to put up a temporary structure for the accommodation of the primary grades, it being impossible to secure a room in which to house them, and the present structure being over crowded. The new building will be located on the south east corner of the school lots, and will be built roughly, but warmly and convenient. It will be of only one story, about 60x25, and contain two rooms. This will be made to do until such time as a new and larger edifice can be erected.
