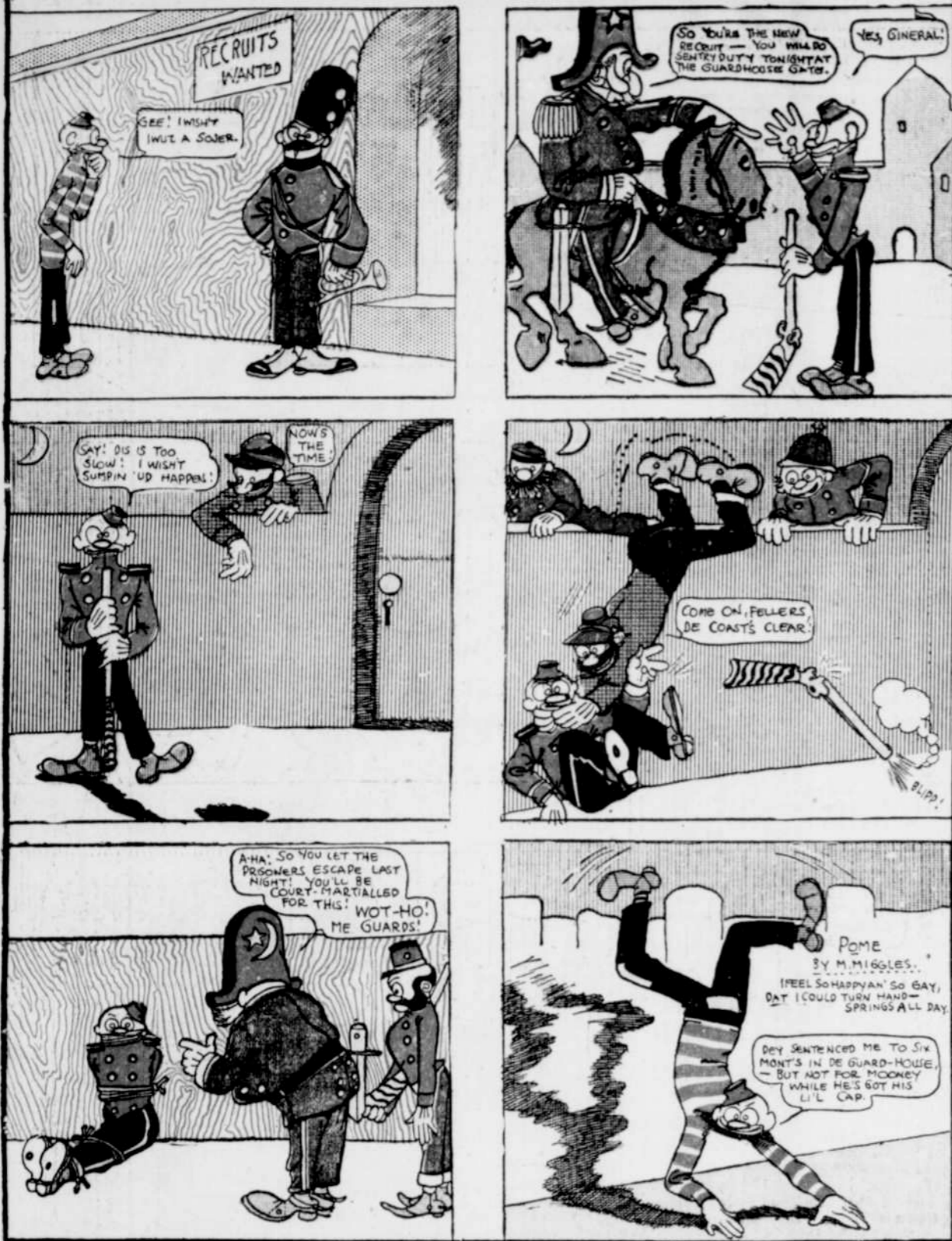

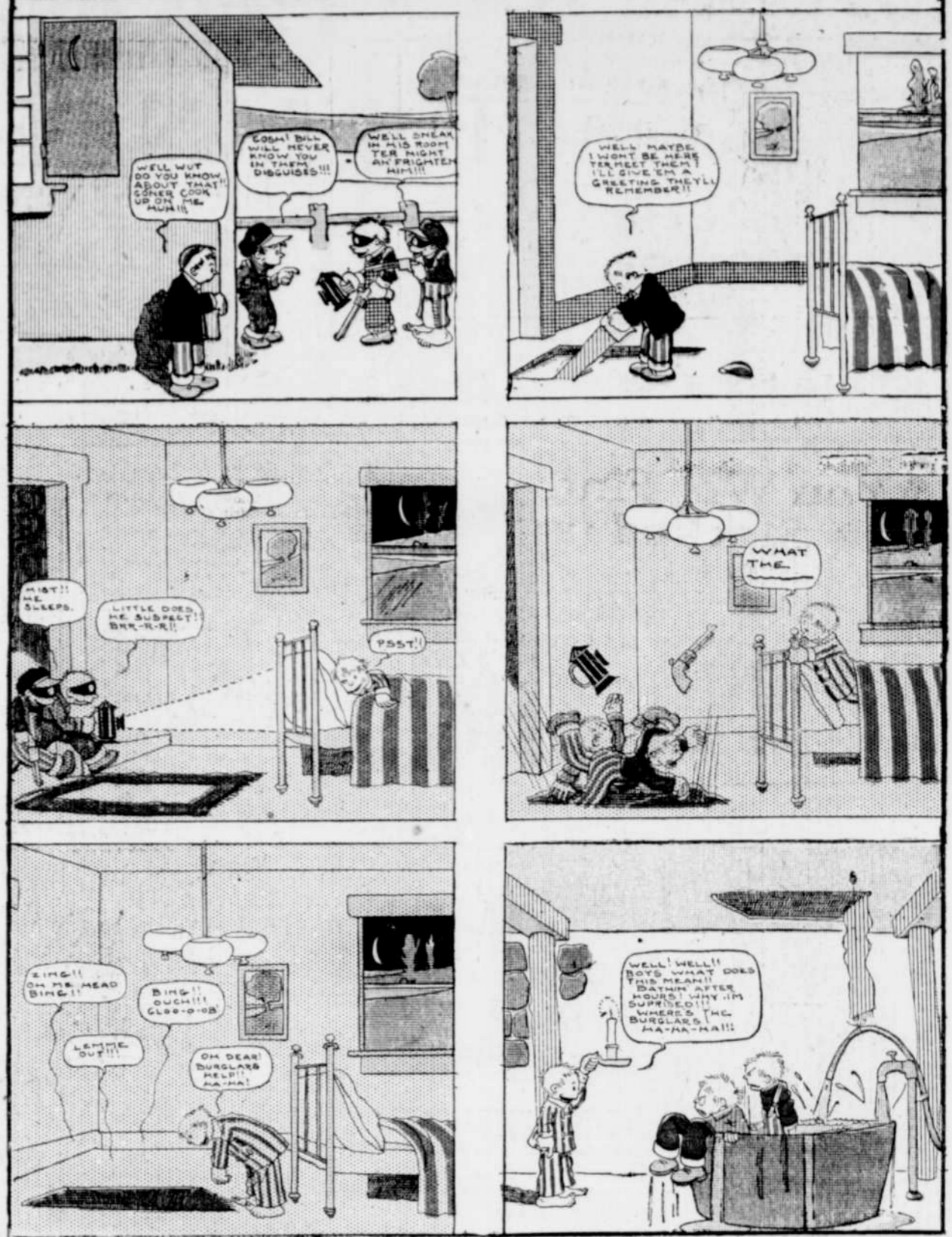

A sorry sight, alack!



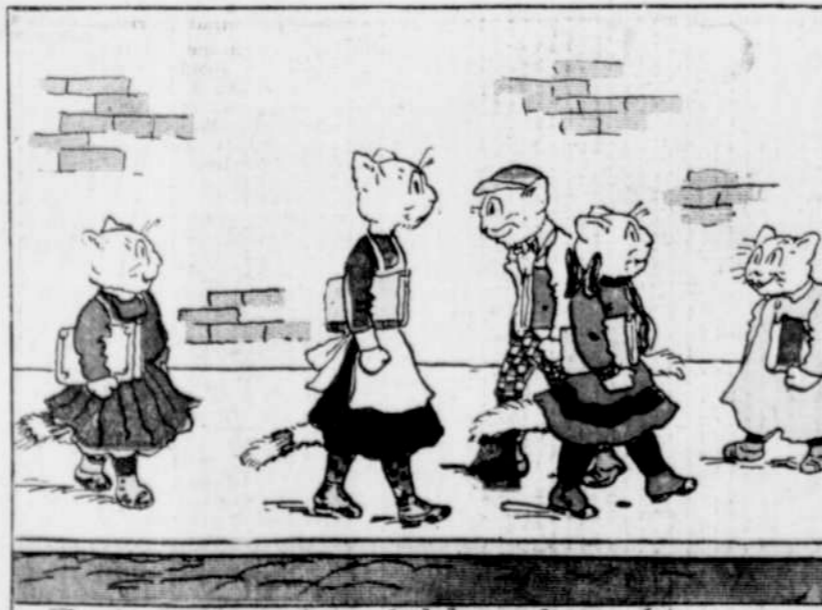
Pinkie loved her books as friends,

She thought was rather mean.



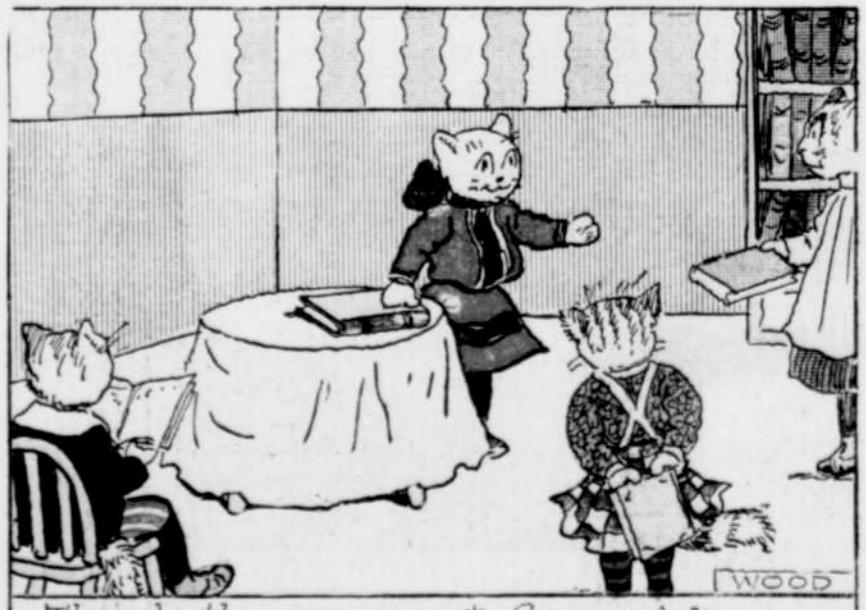
Widow Campbell kept a store
