BIG DEED FOR RECORD.

Think of One Containing 22,000 Words.

County Clerk Smith showed us this morning a deed which has been sent in to be put on record which will keep Recorder Toner and his big typewriter busy for some time transcribing it to the Record of Deeds of Polk county. It is from the Falls City Lumber company to Augustus Peabody and consists of 43 pages of printed matter and 16,000 words. It will cost about \$35 to have it recorded, the cost averaging about \$1 a page, as now written up by typewriter. This, however, is not the largest deed that has been filed with Clerk Smith for record. The largest one was from E. Clemens Horst company to the Mercantile Trust company, of San Francisco. It involved a consideration of \$400,000, contained 23,000 words, took up 42 typewriter pages of the record and cost \$45 to record.
