### FIVE MORE FOR THE OREGONS.

Oregons 34: Seattle Y. M. C. A. 16.  
Although the ability of the Oregons to play basket ball had been clearly demonstrated in the first two games played, there had been no such demand for a spurt as at Seattle.

Oregons 35: Ellensburg 3.  
Contrary to expectations the court was a fun one, free from all obstructions whatever. The team at Seattle is made up of a good-sized, lanky bunch of men that play a pretty steady game.

Oregons 36: Spokane Y. M. C. A. 14.  
The game at Spokane was an easy victory for the Oregons, and was free from all unpleasantness whatever.

Oregons 37: Portland Y. M. C. A. 17.  
In the coal-mining town of Roslyn the "Oregons" were put into a chicken-coop, the door was closed, then it was play-ball. Expecting high at one end and one side there was no out-of-bounds at all, a gym very unfavorable to a clean cut game.

Oregons 38: Portland Y. M. C. A. 17.  
The visitors began from the first by dropping them in lively fashion. The miners played stubbornly but whenever they started a little team play some long web-footer would reach up and pull down a high one or some shorty like Rice or Morton would move in quickly and the ball took its flight in a new direction.

Oregons 39: Portland Y. M. C. A. 17.  
This was the first game in which Rice played. He tossed three field goals and eight foul baskets in twelve tries. Fenton made five field goals, N. Shaw six, Morton three, Roselyn caged eleven out of seventeen foul tries, and made three field baskets. After a good lead had

been secured the "Oregons" took matters pretty easy. Good feeling predominated throughout. The boys began to feel pretty hungry about this time, some saying they hadn't had all they could eat since leaving Portland.

Oregons 40: Portland Y. M. C. A. 17.  
On a skating rink floor 95 feet between baskets, the Oregons here played what might be justly called an exhibition game for despite the fact that interesting mix-ups did at times occur, that's about all the game amounted to.

Oregons 41: Portland Y. M. C. A. 17.  
Ellensburg started the ball rolling by getting the first and her only field goal. With the superior work of the Oregons the game soon developed into an exhibition of basket tossing in which Reed getting nine, Fenton ten, N. Shaw four, Morton one, C. Shaw one. The long court made the center position a tiring one and "kept down the score."

Oregons 42: Roslyn Y. M. C. A. 17.  
After the game the losers gave the boys a fine feed which made less unpleasant the long wait for the 2:15 train that night at Spokane.

Oregons 43: Spokane Y. M. C. A. 14.  
The game at Spokane was an easy victory for the Oregons, and was free from all unpleasantness whatever.

Oregons 44: Portland Y. M. C. A. 17.  
In commenting on the game the Spokesman Review said in part: "The Dallas team presented some basket ball that was a revelation to local experts of the game. It was a treat to watch a team like that of Dallas work. Its everymember knows what to do, seems to know just where every other member of his team is, to know just when to pass and when to shoot and is deadly accurate in both shooting and passing. They are quick-witted, foot-footed and powerful men. The Y. M. C. A. played good basket ball for its ability, but it was out closed."

Oregons 45: Portland Y. M. C. A. 17.  
The Dallas team is believed by many critics to be the strongest that has ever appeared in this city, not excepting the Chicago Meteors, the O. A. C. team, the Mustangs, Y. M. C. A., the Minnesota Red Wings and the W. S. C. team. What it will do against the crack eastern five is a question. Critics here believe it will easily win a majority of its games.

Oregons 46: Portland Y. M. C. A. 17.  
In the matter of basket throwing Mann

(forward) threw three, Pride (forward) one, Ore (guard) one. For the Oregons Reed shot six, Fenton three, N. Shaw eleven, Morton five, C. Shaw one.

From Spokane a jump of 384 miles was made to Butte, the team arriving about 3:30 at night, a short and pleasant ride from here to the next scene of action, Anaconda.

Oregons 2: Anaconda 16.  
In the Anaconda team the Oregons met the fastest aggregation thus far on the trip, a bunch said to have played together for five years and works together in a good style of play.

Oregons 3: Anaconda 16.  
It was thought best on the part of the management to shift the line-up slightly, Fenton going center and Rice forward. Owing to being unused to the combination partly and hard luck mostly the Anaconda team took the lead from the start holding it throughout the first half finishing 12 to 6 to the good. The crowd was wild with excitement a victory nearly in their grasp. The Oregons thought otherwise.

Oregons 4: Anaconda 16.  
The second half began "Peb" was found in the center ring and Fenton back to his old station. Right off the trip, a bunch said to have played together for five years and works together in a good style of play.

Oregons 5: Anaconda 16.  
The good work for the Oregons was not getting going until the floor the score growing gradually while the lid was put down on Anaconda's field basket batters so high they couldn't get a toe on their credit.
