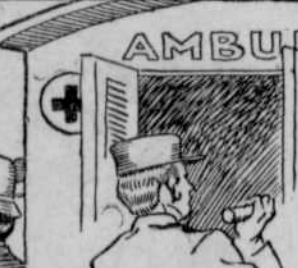

Mrs. Ben Windsor Passes Away at Her Lincoln Home.

The funeral was held Sunday at 12 a. m. at the family home, and interment made at Zena cemetery, Rev. McKinley officiating.
