RESSLER OUT
For Job of State School Superintendent of Instruction.

E. D. Kessler, president of the Monmouth normal school, according to his Salem friends, will shortly announce his intention of accepting the position of superintendent of public instruction.

E. D. Kessler has been in Oregon since 1897, and has been a prominent figure in school work for nearly four years here. He was city superintendent of schools at Eugene, and the people of that town are still talking of his arduous labors and his success in organizing the high school and graduating its first class from the 12th grade. In 1901 and 1902 Mr. Kessler was assistant superintendent of education at the state university, and since that has been at the head of the Monmouth normal. He was the first president of the Oregon state teachers' association, national director for Oregon in the national educational association for eight years, was elected to a scholarship in Yale in 1902, and offered fellowship in Columbia university, New York, in 1903. He graduated in 1901 from Otter-

bein university.
Mr. Kessler is well known throughout the state on account of his connection with the public school, normal and university work. He is a pleasing speaker, an effective institute worker and is noted for his dogged persistence. A case in point is cited by his friends, when he graduated a class of 48 from Monmouth without state aid.

FOR A NEW SCHOOL HOUSE.
Vote to be Taken on Question of Bonding District soon.

At a meeting of the school directors of District 2 last night at the office of the secretary of the board, H. G. Campbell, the matter of bonding the district for sufficient funds to erect a first class edifice, up-to-date in every particular and supply the needs of Dallas' rapidly growing school population was thoroughly discussed, and the clerk instructed to take the necessary steps toward the calling of a meeting for that purpose. As has been repeatedly stated in the Itemizer, the directors of the district are now so overcrowded as to seriously impair proper study, to say nothing of the health of the scholars so closely confined. The board of directors were unanimous in opinion last night that it would be better to erect a new school building, a situation that has to be met and there is no getting around it, the best thing to be done is to erect another block of ground, somewhere in a convenient location and put up a school building that would be a credit to the town, and suffice for its needs for years to come. There is no one thing that will tend more to bring the district into the first class school buildings. It is suggested that this one be of stone, of which we have an abundant supply of the very best obtainable, right at our doors, and that the building be of sufficient size to obviate the necessity in a few years more of being compelled to make larger quarters to supply the demands of education. Our present wooden structure can be utilized to some extent for some grades, but we have not room for the putting up of another building and provide proper play grounds, a necessity which must be looked after fully as carefully as the building itself. Location of the new building is as yet problematical, it is of course being the desire of the voters of the district that it be located in a suitable building.
