COUNCIL MEETING.

Judges and Clerks Named for City Election.

The city council met in regular session last Monday evening with all officers present except Alderman Cook and Stratton.

City Attorney Toome delivered an opinion as to the liability of the water company in repairing streets after fixing mains, he holding that their contract did not in any way abrogate the repair work as prescribed by a city ordinance. This was brought up by the arrest of Mr. Soehren Monday for not complying with the ordinance, he complaining that compliance with the ordinance would work great hardship to the water company and a loss of time to the city.

Fenton reported a nuisance at the old academy, and the marshal was ordered to abate.

Ayres moved the repair of Stiles and Green Campbell private crosswalks, and same was ordered.

Fenton reported sale of 500 feet of water pipe at \$5 each.

Ayres reported result of visit to county court and the same was accepted.

Ayres asked for warrant for \$121.10 street improvement bonds, interest, granted.

At this point a long discussion, and somewhat heated, ensued over what constituted a street intersection, being precipitated by Mayor Eakin having refused to build the 5 feet 4 inches necessary to connect his property. It has been an established custom of the city that those corners be built by the property owners.
