WOOD BLOCK PAVEMENT.

Mr. George Gerlinger is an enthusiastic believer that wooden blocks as paving material have not as yet been surpassed in durability by any of the patented substitutes. Especially for streets that are subjected to hard traffic and constant auto travel, he thinks there could be nothing better, and we fully coincide with him in the latter contention, especially where laid as will be hereafter inscribed in this article. The cost as given in our experts cannot be judged from as representing local conditions, where we have the blocks at our doors. Mr. Gerlinger furnishes us a consular report on such paving from which we make the following excerpts:

"The successful experience of the city of Wellington in its method of laying wood block pavements has aroused much interest in other cities of New Zealand and Australia. It seems likely that the Wellington method may be adopted in many instances where it is intended to repave business streets.

The wood block pavements in Wellington cost about \$4.38 per square yard to lay, whereas the pavements in the same city made from crushed stone or "metal" cost \$1 to \$1.25 per square yard. The latter pavements, however, do not last more than about three years on any business street, whereas the wood block pavements will last under the heaviest traffic for probably 20 years, provided they are occasionally coated with tar and sprinkled with sand. The only renewals of such pavements laid in Wellington eight years ago have been in a few spots where the ground was soft, so the underlying concrete sank, but in no instance due to the fault of the pavement itself and in no place where the bottom was good. The wood blocks used were of jarrah wood imported from Western Australia.

The method of laying wood-block pavements in Wellington has been furnished by the city engineer, as follows:

The roadway is excavated to a depth of 11 3/4 inches below the finished surface level of pavement. Six inches of concrete (composed of six parts of ballast to one part of Portland cement) are laid over the whole width of the roadway and floated to a smooth surface. Jarrah blocks, 5 inches deep, cut from planks measuring 6 by 3, 7 by 3, or 8 by 3 inches are dipped in hot tar and then laid in courses 3 inches wide across the street, the blocks in each course and the several courses being placed as close together as possible. Expansion joints 1 inch wide of well worked clay are laid alongside side curb. The whole surface is coated with boiled tar, well brushed in, and then sprinkled with coars sand. This tarring and sanding are repeated as found necessary. The sand used is taken from the seabach, the particles being about the size of rice.

For outlying streets and roads in Wellington, where the traffic is not heavy, crushed stone or macadam pavements are still preferred, and such are the ordinary pavements in other New Zealand cities, except in Auckland, where there is considerable use of asphalt, its main business street being paved in that way.
