C. H. Farmer made a business trip to Yamhill county the latter part of last week. M. Dennett and F. M. Edgar were business visitors in Dallas last Saturday.

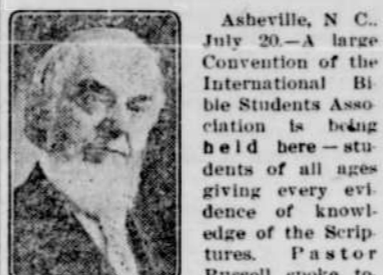
WEST SALEM.
