**Mrs. Dodge Leaves Many Relatives and Friends to Mourn.**

Mrs. William W. Dodge, whose death by cancer occurred in Dallas on Tuesday, October 7, 1913, was born in Jefferson county, Wisconsin, on November 24, 1850. She was married to William Dodge on July 2, 1881, at Fort Atkinson, Wisconsin. She came to Oregon about four years ago, and until lately lived in Marion county, coming to Dallas recently. She was of a cheerful disposition, well liked by all who knew her, and a great favorite among her acquaintances. Although an intense sufferer from the dread disease that was sapping her life away, she bore the trial with cheerfulness and was a living example of true fortitude. She was laid to rest in the Odd Fellows cemetery Thursday afternoon, the services being conducted by Revs. D. M. Metzger and C. P. Gates. Besides many sorrowing acquaintances, she leaves to sincerely mourn her loss a fond husband and two adoring children, Rufus F. Dodge, of Lewisville, and Miss Letta Dodge, at home. Several children were born to the union, the others having passed before. Mrs. Dodge also leaves three brothers and a sister in the east. She was a member of the Beavers and carried an insurance of \$1600, payable to the children.
