

JUNIOR GOVERNMENT.

Representative in Dallas for Purpose of Organization.

C. Clarence Likens, the supervisor of the Portland Junior Government, was in our city on last Sunday and Monday, looking over the city and finding out the prospects of organizing a Junior Government among our juvenile citizens. It is the plan of Mr. Likens, who is working with Mayor VanOrsdahl and the leader of the Boy Scouts, to make an organization here like the one in Portland. There they have a junior mayor, four commissioners, an auditor, chief of police and a juvenile police force of about 200 boys. At each election they have their own ballots and every boy and girl in the city above 14 years of age takes part in the election. An organization of this kind has the effect of combining practice and theory and acquiring knowledge of the world of politics, statesmanship, the professions or mechanics and how to carry a living. Combination of theory and practice makes education much more thorough and the pupil acquires the habit and learns the practical application of theories. In other words, he learns to apply his book knowledge to the actual experiences of life. Organizations of this nature will be a very great aid to our public schools and one of the best methods of directing the youth in matters that pertain to the general welfare, and their own beneficial education in particular. This will accomplish great things for the junior citizen, in giving them a good knowledge of the manner of conducting a government and having an actual part in it. It will give them a incentive to read and keep posted on public affairs and long before they are of age be able to take part in them. Especially should they understand the duties of voters and their responsibilities for their vote and its influence in determining who shall be officers in charge of affairs and their part in making laws, and learning what are needed.

Mr. Likens expects to return to Dallas and form an organization of this kind here about the first of February. Meanwhile everyone boost for it.

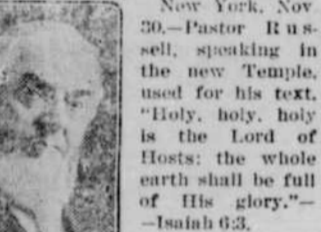
