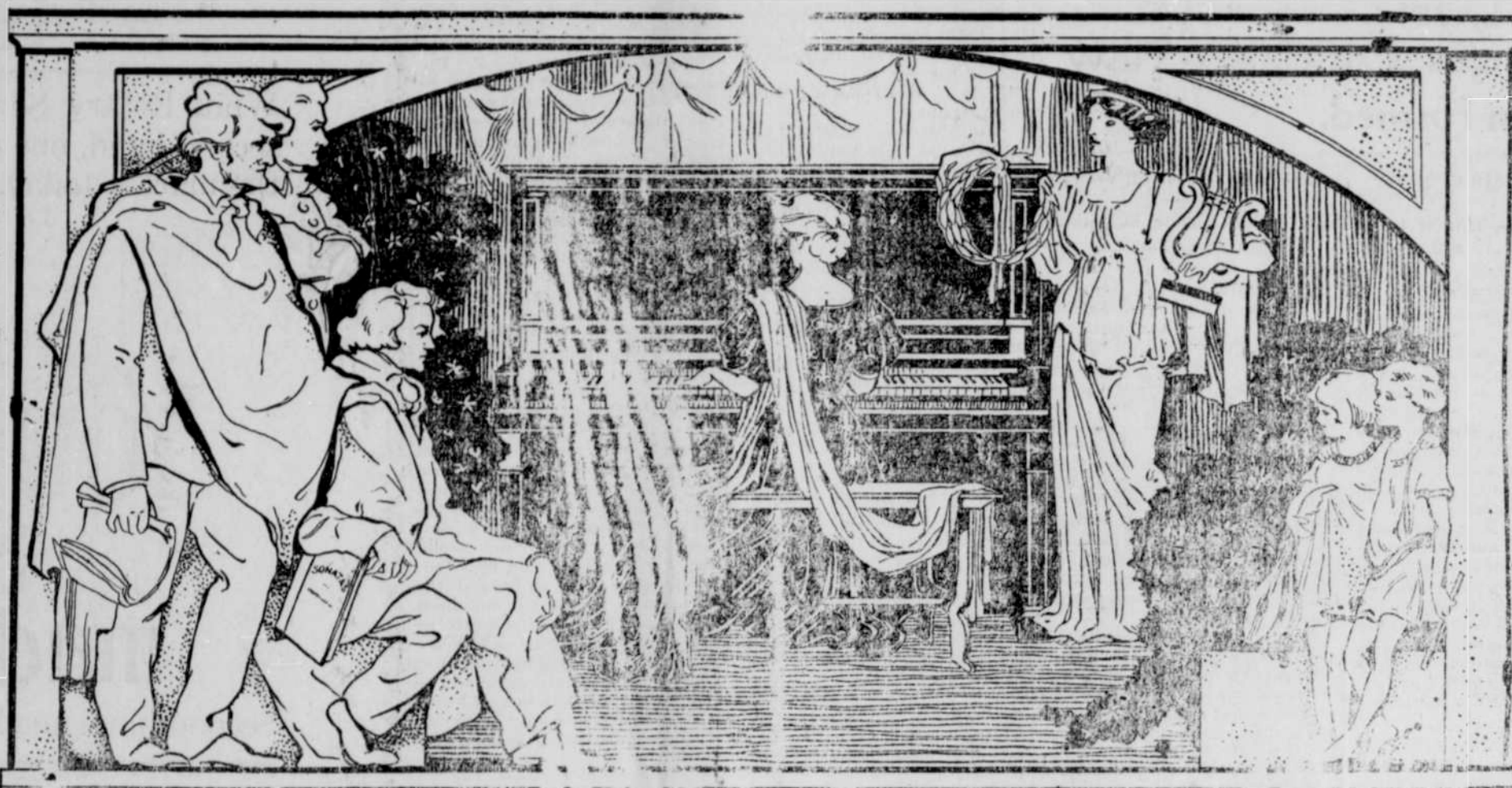

Of the three Pacific coast states, Oregon and Washington far outstrip California in the work done by private owners for forest protection.

Delegates from organizations of sportsmen in all parts of the state will meet at Portland Monday, March 16th, to form a state association. There are now fifty-four clubs of hunters and fishermen in clubs indicate that there will be a full representation of all sportsmen at the convention.

In his selection of his first assistant, Postmaster Myers, of Portland, has shown rare discretion. The new appointee is a man of long and acceptable experience in the different departments of postoffice inspection, one who knows the work from the ground up, and who will be a most efficient aid.

To be or not to be a candidate is the question that is now agitating the minds of many of our citizens. Whether to suffer the outrageous ills that fall to the lot of an office-seeker, or wiser, it is better to stifle the ambition at its inception and let some other bear the burden of the long and arduous eight months' campaign.

After six long weeks away from our own little home town it seems most awful good to us to again get back to old familiar scenes and faces. They can talk as they want to regarding the delights of travel, the view of new things, the hurry and bustle of the cities, but give us every time the view from our own God-chosen doorway, the intimate mixing with those we have known and appreciated at their true worth for these long years, and the clear, pure, free air that gives us the exhilaration necessary for a night of good and peaceful sleep, undisturbed by sounds that continually beset one in the city.

The net operating revenue of all of the railroads of the state for the year ending June 30, 1913, was \$3,632,743.82, a gain of \$368,155.15 over the figures for the previous year. Total operating revenue of all roads on state business was \$14,895,885.53, of which \$5,160,464.78 came from freight, \$8,777,928.56 from passengers, \$380,626.44 from other passenger train revenue, \$235,429.75 from other transportation services, and \$311,443 from sources other than transportation. Oregon's proportion of interstate railroad revenue is almost equal to the state revenue, being \$29,463,042.09. The operating expense assigned to Oregon amounts to \$19,261,509.90, leaving a net operating income of \$10,201,532.19. As the taxes totalled \$1,568,788.37, the clear net return stands \$8,632,743.82.
