The census office has issued the following statistics of cereal production in Oregon for the census year ending May 31, 1890, compiled by Mr. Charles E. Kindt under the direction of Mr. John Hyde, special agent in charge of agriculture.

The total area devoted to cereals was 829,065 acres, as compared with 632,871 acres at the tenth census.

Rev. Andreas Hauge, of Skien, Norway, died at the age of 76 years.

Mr. Gustaf Ericson, a prominent factory owner of Eskilstuna, Sweden, is dead.

The Tinnos paper factory at Tinnoson, Norway, was burned down the other day.

The wife of farmer Nils Norgaard, of Halland, Denmark, was drowned in a well.

Influenza is raging in nearly all small cities and villages on the Norwegian coast.

The Norwegian steamer Siggen, was wrecked off Bergen. The crew was saved.

Mrs. Anna Beata Horner died at Skuttunge, Upland, at the age of 100 years.

"Par Gynst," the famous play by Ibsen, will be performed at the Christiania theatre.

Diphtheria is raging epidemically in Djovin, Norway. All the schools have been closed.

It is supposed that Johan Sverdrup will be elected president of the Norwegian Storting.

The crown prince has been appointed lieutenant general in the Norwegian and Swedish army.

The fourteenth convention of Scandinavian naturalists will be held in Copenhagen, July 4-9.

Peter Hysing, the librarian of the public museum in Bergen, Norway, died at the age of 87 years.

The fourth convention of Scandinavian philologists will take place in Copenhagen July 18-21.

Their golden wedding was celebrated by A. Bowman, a well-known citizen of Soderhamn, and his wife.

Baron Hubleran, a young Danish sculptor, living in Paris, committed suicide by shooting himself, the other day.
