Our illustration question is how to produce the largest crop. He may have the most prolific queens, he may have a successful wintering, and his colonies be in fine condition four or five weeks previous to the beginning of the honey harvest, but, misled by fine weather and the lively flight of his bees, he forgets that flowers generally yield no honey just at that period, and that the consumption of their stores is greatest when brood rearing is at its best. Everything may seem prosperous until he sees dead larvæ at the alighting board.

Upon examination he finds the hives full of bees, no stores and little or no larvæ in the cells. The bees, being short of food and moved by a sense of self preservation, had sacrificed their young.
