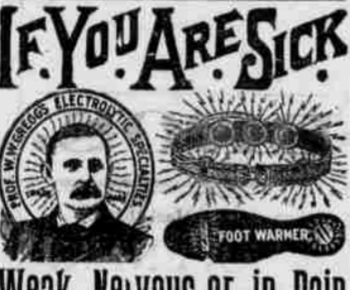

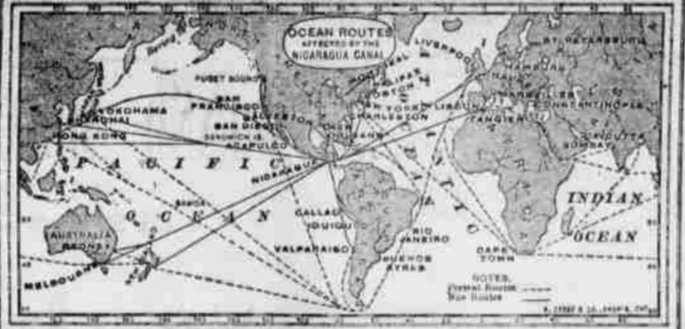


Table showing statistics for the Nicaragua Canal project, including miles present and miles via Nicaragua Canal.
