Ashes for Rose Insects. In La Nature the statement is made that if wood ashes are sifted when dry over the heads of rosebushes, after they have been syringed with water, the ashes will adhere to the leaves, and on Tickets Trees Europe, account of their alkaline nature will soon make it very uncomfortable for any insect pest that may infest them. The ashes in moderate quantities will not injure the plants, but on the other hand will be rather beneficial as a fertilizer when washed off into the soil, says the California Fruit Grower.
