The death of "Okonogan" Smith is announced. He was one of Washington's foremost pioneers.

The excitement in the East now is the opening of the Cherokee strip. Thousands are rushing in to get homes.

PROPER up in this neck-o'-the-woods looks upon Hon. W. R. Ellis as the proper man to succeed himself as congressman of the second district of Oregon.

The Portland Telegram and the San Francisco Examiner say that Cleveland has become a dictator, and both plainly warn him against such a course. Both papers are right.

EASTERN shipments of cattle are now attracting some attention, as it is claimed that the net results are better than received from sales made in Portland or on the Sound.

GOLD billion to the amount of \$105,000 was found missing at the Philadelphia mint recently. An old employe was charged with the theft and finally admitted it, turning over the stolen property.

REPORTS from below and also from the East confirm the general impression that times are improving steadily. And this is being brought about without any repeal of the Sherman law. This law should remain as it is until the administration becomes willing that something better for silver should take its place.

JOHN C. LUCE and Sheriff Combs are having quite a set-to. Mr. Luce was arrested a few days ago and put in jail a short time. This was brought about by an article in the Issue, charging Combs with being too intimate with some woman in the vicinity. Mr. Luce is now out on \$500 bond to await the action of the next grand jury.

Some members of the house are filibustering against the repeal of the federal election laws. These are composed of republicans, and administration democrats who are afraid that the calling up this measure while the repeal of the Sherman is under consideration will seriously affect the latter. But it proves one thing—that it is just as fair for the senate to filibuster against the unconditional repeal measure as for the house to oppose legislation in the same way.

The Geary law has been annulled without any effort having been made to bring about its enforcement. It is estimated that Chinese have taken \$810,000,000 out of this country to send to China. There can be no good reason to longer delay the operations of the law. There is available over \$30,000 for this purpose, and let it be used, and by the time it is gone congress probably will have appropriated enough to take every Chinaman out of the country, who has no legal right to remain here.

The Salem Statesman says that Eastern Oregon people are talking John C. Luce for congress. First we ever heard of it. And while we think it, hadn't the Statesman better take a little of its own advice and attend to politics in its own district?

The convention of the Pan-American Bimetallite Association, which has been called to meet at St. Louis, Mo., commencing Tuesday, October 3, gives promise of being a very largely attended and important gathering of the advocates of bimetallism. Oregon will be duly represented at this most important convention. Governor Pennover has just issued commissions to five of the representative men of Oregon to be present on that occasion. The gentlemen appointed are: Captain George H. Moffett, editor Evening Telegram Portland; Glen G. Holman, esq., attorney, Portland; ex-Mayor Van B. DeLashmunt, capitalist, Portland; Hon. J. K. Romig, capitalist, La Grande, and Hon. J. K. Weatherford, attorney, of Albany. There will be representatives from every state and territory of the Union, and also from all the states of Central and South America and Mexico.—Telegram.

Governor Markham, of California, has issued a proclamation calling the attention of the people of the trans-Mississippi states and territories to the International Irrigation Congress which is called to convene at Los Angeles, October 10, 1893. The citizens of the arid states are invited and urged to send full delegations to the congress which promises to be the most notable gathering of its kind ever held in this country.

The railroads have practically made a rate of one fare for the round trip from the Missouri river, and a rate of a fare and a third from points west of the Missouri river.

The sessions of the congress will be held in the Grand Opera House, Los Angeles, a handsome structure centrally located on Main street, near First Headquarters for delegates will be at the Hotel Hollenbeck and Hotel Nadeau, each only one block from the opera house, both commodious and elegant in their appointments and service; also at the St. Elmo, a good family hotel, only two blocks north of the opera house.

Several foreign governments will be represented by delegates, and the interior department will be represented by Mr. F. H. Newell, U. S. topographer.

A DISGRACEFUL SCENE. A disgraceful scene, and one which was exceedingly painful to the relatives of the deceased, took place at the burial of George Thomas, at the Catholic cemetery in Walla Walla on Wednesday last.

After the funeral cortege had reached the graveyard and when the remains were about to be lowered to their resting place, a request was made by Rev. M. Flohr, of St. Patrick's church, that the remains should not be interred in consecrated Catholic ground, giving as a reason for his request that deceased was not a member of the church, and had not received the sacrament before death. It is also learned that Father Flohr considered George Thomas' death as a case of suicide, and that, as he had not received the sacrament, his body could not be admitted to burial in Catholic cemetery.

Upon the demand of Father Flohr, a heart-reading scene took place, Joseph Thomas, a brother, stepped forward and in no uncertain tone stated that his brother should be buried beside the remains of his father, who had received interment at the hands of the Catholic church. To this the reverend father objected in no less strenuous terms. "I will die beside the body of my brother answered Joseph Thomas, "before he shall be removed from this grave." Father Flohr, who had ordered that the grave be filled and the cere-

monies discontinued, proceeding to throw one shovelful of earth into the empty grave, at the same time stating in effect that he was not afraid to die—he was doing his duty. Here influential members of the church interceded and expatiated with their pastor, who at last consented to end the embarrassing scene by allowing the burial to proceed. There were no ceremonies, and the remains were quietly laid to rest without the usual benediction or religious services. The Walla Walla Statesman speaks of the incident as an unfortunate affair.
