

In addition to the coal lost in pillars left to support the roof, a considerable portion is lost by becoming mixed with the "gob" or refuse left in the mine: some is reduced to dust by blasting and handling, still more waste is made by rushing, screening and handling in the breaker, and the rejected slate always has more or less coal adhering to it which is lost in the waste dump. Less than forty-five percent, of the coal contained in the thicker beds is sent to market, the balance being wasted.
