### REPUBLICANS CONVENE.

The Delegates From the Various Precincts of Morrow County Meet in Harmony and

#### NOMINATE A FULL TICKET THROUGHOUT.

Congressional Delegates Instructed for Ellis and State Delegates for Brown for Joint Senator.

The delegates to republican convention of Morrow county met at the court house last Saturday morning at 10 o'clock, and in the absence of O. E. Farnsworth, chairman of the county central committee, were called to order by Geo. Conser, congressional committee man from Morrow. A. G. Bartholomew and A. W. Patterson were placed in nomination for temporary chairman. On ballot Bartholomew received 11 votes and Patterson 22. Patterson was declared elected, and on motion appointed F. J. Hallock, temporary secretary, and A. G. Bartholomew, Assat. secretary.

On motion the chairman appointed the different committees, composed of the following: Credentials, C. N. Peck, Lexington; Jas. Royse, Dairy; Geo. Ely, Cecil; N. R. McVey, Dry Fork; and Dan Gallagher, Geary; permanent organization, J. L. Howard, Pine City; Chas. Johnson, Lexington; and Jim Hager, Heppner; order of business, T. R. Howard, Heppner; Jas. Talbot, Matteson; W. B. Parsons, Well Springs; A. Charlton, Eight Mile, and F. J. Hallock, Mt. Vernon; resolutions, A. G. Bartholomew, Alpine; J. W. Hilton, Dairy, and Steve Lalonde, Mt. Vernon. On motion the committee on order of business was to report manner of presenting candidates and voting. Also that representation from Eight Mile be left to credentials committee. The committees were instructed to bring in their reports at 1 p. m., after which the convention adjourned until that hour.

#### AFTERNOON.

The body was called to order by Chairman Patterson at the appointed hour when the reports of the committee were heard.

The committee on credentials reported favorably on the representation adopted by the central committee. The delegates were as follows: Heppner, T. R. Howard, A. Mallory, Robert Hart, Lanus Penland, Pat Quaid, E. A. Brundage, Jas. Jones by J. M. Hager, proxy, A. W. Patterson, and D. Cox. Mt. Vernon, A. M. Gunn, A. M. Slocum, D. W. Hornor, F. J. Hallock and S. Lalonde, Gentry, D. Gallagher, E. R. Bishop by Ed. Hood, proxy, J. N. Elder, W. G. Sweetser and Joe Rector, Cecil, S. Troedson and Geo. D. Ely, Alpine, A. G. Bartholomew and A. Andrews, Dairy, Jas. Hilton, Jas. H. Royse, G. I. Robinson, G. D. Coats and Ben Poppeng. Dry Fork, N. R. McVey and J. O. Maggs, Lexington, C. N. Peck, Chas. Johnson and Wm. Pealand by Ed. Hood, proxy, Lena, Mike Kenny and Jerry Bronson, Well Springs, W. B. Parsons, and John Handy. Ione, W. S. Connor, Frank Engleman and M. J. Williams, Matteson, Jas. Tolbert and Harrison Hale, Pine City, Thos. Scott and J. L. Howard, Eight Mile, Ed. Hood, J. W. Beckett and A. Charlton. The report of the committee was adopted.

The committee on permanent organization recommended that temporary officers be made permanent. Report adopted.

The committee on order of business recommended that the following order be adopted: Election of four delegates to the congressional convention, four delegates to the state convention, nomination for sheriff, representative, clerk, treasurer, commissioner, assessor, school superintendent, surveyor, coroner, justice of the peace and constable for each district, precinct committee, and selection of chairman of the central committee. They further recommend that the vote be taken by individual ballot, and that the first ballot be informal, to bring out the candidates, and on any ballot after this the person receiving a majority of all votes cast should be declared the nominee of the convention. Report adopted.

The committee on resolutions presented the following:

WHEREAS, A state of general depression exists throughout the United States at the present time, capital idle, labor unemployed and upon the verge of starvation and

WHEREAS, Measures are under consideration by the legislative bodies of our country which are a menace to the welfare of her citizens, and particularly of our own state and county, therefore be it

Resolved, By the representatives of the republican party of Morrow county in convention assembled, that we again

assert our unqualified endorsement of the principles of our party, and condemn the unwise, injudicious and ruinous policy pursued by the democratic party, and more particularly their action of matters of legislation which threatens to destroy our leading industries of our county, thereby bankrupting our citizens engaged therein, closing our business houses, and leaving the laborer poorly paid and scantily fed.

Resolved, That we refer with pride to the record of Hon. W. R. Ellis, representative in congress from this district, and that our representatives to the state convention be requested to use their utmost efforts to secure his renomination. Be it further

Resolved, That we endorse the Hon. J. N. Brown, of Heppner, as the choice of this convention for joint senator of Morrow, Grant and Harney counties, and our representatives are requested to give him their unqualified support in the nominating convention.

A. G. BARTHOLOMEW, Secy. J. W. HILTON, Com. The chairman appointed Frank Engleman and Chas. Johnson tellers. The convention then proceeded to ballot for CONGRESSIONAL DELEGATES.

The informal ballot was as follows: A. W. Patterson 21, Geo. Conser 20, F. J. Hallock 15, Jas. Ringer 15, J. W. Dawson 14, J. W. Vaughan 14, D. W. Hornor 14, Mike Kenny, 10, W. E. Kahler 8, S. Lalonde 5, Ed. Hood 4, Frank Gilliam 4, and many other scattered votes. On motion the eight receiving the highest vote were declared elected delegates to the state and congressional convention. Nominations were then declared in order for

#### SHERIFF.

The informal ballot showed G. W. Harrington 21, A. Hood 14, A. A. Roberts 7, L. Large 3, and N. S. Whetstone 2. There being no choice on the first formal ballot, a second ballot was taken which resulted as follows: Harrington 26, Hood 18 and Large 3. Harrington was declared the nominee.

#### REPRESENTATIVE.

The informal ballot showed Patterson 20, Boothby 14, Vaughan 12 and Dawson 1. At this juncture on motion of Thos. Scott the candidates for representative were invited within the bar to define their positions on the political issues of the day. In response O. S. Patterson, J. W. Vaughan and J. S. Boothby addressed the convention. J. N. Brown, as a candidate for joint senator, also defined his position when balloting continued. The third formal ballot resulted as follows: Patterson 21, and Boothby 26. Mr. Boothby, having received a majority of all votes cast, was declared the nominee of the convention for representative.

#### CLERK.

The informal ballot for clerk resulted as follows: Wm. Mallory 17, F. J. Hallock 12, E. P. Vornz 11, A. W. Patterson 4, and W. E. Kahler 3. Patterson thanked the gentleman for the complimentary vote but informed them that he was not a candidate for county clerk. The second formal ballot showed the following result: Hallock 26, Mallory 18 and Vornz 3. Hallock was declared the nominee.

#### TREASURER.

The informal ballot for treasurer resulted as follows: Lichtenthal 19, Gilliam 12, Hornor 11, Briggs 4, and blank 1. After the first formal ballot D. W. Hornor withdrew and the next ballot resulted as follows: Gilliam 27, Lichtenthal 18, Briggs 1, and Hornor 1. Gilliam was declared the nominee for treasurer.

#### COMMISSIONER.

On the informal ballot J. L. Howard received 26. A. Charlton 10, A. L. Cornett 6, N. R. McVey 1, Young 1 and blank 1. On motion the vote was made formal and J. L. Howard declared the nominee for commissioner.

#### ASSESSOR.

This fight proved to be quite different from the commissioner, being strongly contested to the finish. The informal vote showed: Willis 18, Jayne 10, Miller 8, Cook 4, Lord 4, Hamilton 2, blank 2 and Handy 1. The second formal ballot resulted as follows: Willis 23, Miller 12, Jayne 9, and Cook 1. J. F. Willis having received a majority of all votes cast was declared the nominee for assessor.

#### SCHOOL SUPERINTENDENT.

The informal ballot showed the following vote: J. F. Royse 15, J. W. Shipley 13, W. L. Saling 7, Miss Martha Neville 6, Anna Balsiger 5, and blank 1. The leading candidates on the first formal vote were Miss Balsiger 13, J. F. Royse 13 and J. W. Shipley 12. The second formal ballot resulted as follows: Miss Balsiger 24, Royse 14, Shipley 6, Saling 1, Miss Neville 1 and blank 1. Miss Balsiger having received a majority of all votes cast was declared the nominee of the convention for superintendent.

#### SURVEYOR.

G. W. Lord was nominated surveyor

by acclamation.
