Soldiers of the late war, pensioned under one law, may apply for higher rates under other laws, without losting may rights.

Thousands of soldiers drawing from \$2 to \$to per month under the old law are entitled to higher rates under new law, not only on account of disabilities for which now pensioned, but also for others, whether due to service or not.
