WORKING FOR THE SETTLER.—A letter has been received by parties in The Dalles, says the Chronicle, from Senator Mitchell, concerning the situation of the settlers who have made improvements on the forfeited railroad lands, and stating that he has had considerable trouble in accomplishing anything in the senate. The secretary of the interior takes the position that the original act required "actual settlement," and that he has no power or right to change it. The commissioner of the land office, however, takes the settlers' view of it, that possession and improvement are sufficient, without actual settlement. Mr. Ellis has succeeded in getting a favorable report on a bill in the house for the relief of such as have made improvements on said railroad lands, in good faith, and Senator Mitchell has strong hopes of getting favorable action on the bill in the senate before congress adjourns, as he fully realizes the justice of the settler's claim.

BOARD OF TRADE MEETING.—Yesterday Heppner's board of trade met at the council chambers. President Geo. W. Conner presiding, Ed. R. Bishop, secretary. The report of Messrs. Minor, Sperry and Gilliam was then heard, Mr. Oscar Minor acting as chairman and spokesman. He described every part of the proposed new road in the Mitchell section, the greater part of which in detail cannot be given, as the report was a verbal one. The estimated expense of making the road will not exceed \$1,000, which does not include the right-of-way. The principal expense will be on Parrish creek, but the road through the Hay stock region will be comparatively inexpensive. A letter was read from E. H. Clarke who reports that the Mitchell people are very anxious for the road and desire to haul their spring clip over to Heppner which is about half the distance as the present one to The Dalles. The ford across the John Day is a good one, and will be passable most of the year. The Kahler creek route through Haystack was selected by the committee as the shortest and best route. The meeting adjourned to call by the president.
