Thousands of soldiers drawing from is to ito per month under the old law are entitled to higher rates under new law, not only on account of disabilities for which new pensioned, but also for others, whether due to service or not.

Soldiers and salors disabled in line of duty in regular army or navy since the war are also survivors, and their widows, of the Black Hawk, Crock, Cherokee and Seminole or Flor.
