This demonetization was the result of a combination among half a dozen of the leading gamblers of the Gold Board, which has its ramification abroad. The coinage committee of the house reported a "bill to codify the mint laws." The necessity for that codification was well known, and the chairman explained that no change had been made in any of the laws, but that the different acts bearing upon the mint had been brought together under one section. The bill was not even read except by title. It was passed without one dissenting vote. In the section enumerating the different lawful silver coins of the United States the word "dollar" was omitted, beginning "the half dolomission. The word had been stricken out by some member of the committee without the knowledge of his unsuspecting colleagues; but who did it has never been discovered.
