AGRICULTURAL QUARANTINE REGULA-TIONS.

At a special meeting of the Ore on State Board of Horticulture, held in Portland April 2, 1895, all members present, the following regulations were adopted, in accordance with the laws regulating such matters, and are, therefore, binding upon all persons. The regulations are to take effect and be in force from and after May 4, 1895:

Rule 1-All consignees, agents or other persons, shall, within twenty-four hours, notify the quarantine officers of the State board of Horticulture, or a fees for state officers; abolishing railroad duly commissioned quarantined guardian of the arrival of any trees, plants, bude or cions at the quarantine station, in the district of final destination. Rule 2-All trees, plants, cuttings,

grafts, buds or cions, imported or

brought into the state from any foreign country, or from any of the United States or territories, are hereby required to be inspected upon arrival at the quarantine station in the district of final destination, and if any such nursery stock, trees, plants, cuttings, grafts, buds or cions are found to be free of insect pests and funguous diseases, the said quarantine officer or duly commissioned quarantine guardian shall issue a certificate to that effect. And furthermore, if any of said trees, plants, outtings, grafts, buds or cions are found infested with insect pests, fungi, blight or other diseases injurious to fruit or to fruit trees, or other trees or plants, they shall be disinfected and remain in quarantine until the quarantine officer of the State Board of Horticulture or the duly commissioned quarantine guardian can determine whether the said trees, plants, cuttings, grafts, buds or cions are free from live injurious insect pests or their eggs, larvae or pupse, or fongous diseases before they can be offered for sale, gift, distribution or transportation. All persons or companies are hereby prohibited from carrying any trees, plants, cuttings, grafts, buds or cions from without the state to any point within the state beyond the nearest point on its line or course to the quarantine station in the district of ultimate destination, or from any point within the state to any other point therein, until such trees, plants, cuttings, grafts, buds or cions have been duly inspected, and if required disinfeeted as hereinbefore provided, and all such shipments must be accompanied by the proper certificates of the inspecting officer. Provided, however, that after such persons or company has given the proper officer four days' notice, he

REVIEWING THE LEGISLATURE.

The state printer has sent out, in accordance with the usual custom of the enterprising and not niggardly paid publishing house at which he presides, a neatly bound pamphlet of some pages, entitled "General Laws of Eighteenth Regular Session of the Legislative Assembly." A strange feeling of melancholy comes over the reviewer as he takes up this work, suggestive for the most part of "might-have-beens." This volume, for example, might have contained laws substituting salaries for commission; putting district attorneys on salaries; appropriating less money for clerks; cutting down allowances for disbursements in the capitol building; relieving taxation for beneficiary schools and colleges; for preserving the salmon industry;; protecting depositors in savings banks; putting the National Guard and the state university on the same footing before the law as other objects of state aid. This volume does not contain special laws, and probably that is the reason why no mention is made of amendments to the charter of the city of Portland, by which the taxpayers of this city would be saved \$200,000 a year, now unnecessarily wrung from them by highhanded officialism.-Oregonian, June 9.

It was a misfortune that the last legislature was not composed of better men than it was composed of. It is true Joseph Simon was there. That was a redeeming feature of the senate. Mr. Payton was there in the house, and so there was one upright man in Sodom. Mr. Gullixson, who alone in the preceding legislature, lobbied through bills aggregating nearly \$500,000, was there, but only as a committee clerk, and could not give the people the benefit of his entire time and influence for only \$5 a day. But Harvey Scott and H. W. Corbett and Mr. Failing and several more of the sturdy yoemanry of Portland and disinterested friends of the people were not there. But they were ably represented by the talented Senator McGinn, of Multnomah county, that brilliant cross between a Donnybrook Irishman and a Hoboken German, and so all was not lost.

The enterprise of Mr. McGinn only enabled him to use \$2150 for engrossing the senate bills, when the same work was doze in the house for \$535.
