

"That's straight so far as it goes, but, of course, there is a good deal more to it before you can work up such an article as this here. In the first place you have got to get the right kind of a hog. I generally use a Berkshire or an Essex, because they are good and broad and you can feed 'em up to be pretty lazy. This is necessary, of course, as a frisky hog is not liable to hold mud or water either for a long time. The next

step is to get the right kind of soil. "Now, I always use dirt collected from ant hills, but this is an old dodge borrowed from the East Indian jugglers, who can make a mango sprout and grow six or seven feet in as many min tes. Scientists say that it is the formic acid in earth which causes seed to burst and the germ to develop when placed therein, and this acid is freely generated by the ant. Pour a cupful of hot water over a handful of the insects and it will become as sour as vinegar. "Of course it is easy enough to get a teach him to keep it there all right.
