BEN HOLLADAY AND A POKER GAME. Session of Two Weeks Which Ended in a Laughable Incident.

From the Washington News. Judge Noah, one of the oldest and best known Washington correspondents, has a fund of stories about old-timers here at the capital that is practically inexhaustible.

General Rufus Ingalls, who in 1841 was a captain and assistant quartermaster, and subsequently obtained the rank of quartermaster general, was one of the Pacific coast party which played daily with Grant when they were together in Oregon, but although recognized as a past-master of the game, Ingalls was no match for the little close-mouthed infantry captain.

It is narrated by Judge Noah on the authority of the aforesaid army officer that on one occasion Holladay, Grant, Ingalls and Nesmith engaged in a game of poker which lasted two weeks, night and day.

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
