



THE ART OF ADVERTISING.

The Chicago Dry Goods Reporter very correctly says that there is nothing on earth so mysteriously funny as the way in which many business men treat an advertisement.

The prime, first, last and all the time object of an advertisement is to draw custom. So the merchant waits until the busy season comes, and the store is so full that he can't get his hat off, and then he rushes to the newspaper of his town and goes in for advertising.

When the dull season comes along and there is no trade, and he wants to sell his goods so badly, then he "can't afford it," or "it is too expensive," he says—that is, some of them do; but occasionally a level-headed merchant does more of it, and scoops in all the trade, while his rivals are making mortgages to pay the gas bill.

There are times when you couldn't stop people from buying everything in the store if you planted a couple of cannon behind the door, and then is the advertisement sent out on its holy mission. It makes light work for the ad, for a chalk sign on the door could do all that was needed, and be able to take half a holiday six days in the week, but who wants to favor an advertisement? They are built to do hard work, and should be sent out in the dull days, when a customer has to be knocked down with hard facts, kicked insensible with bankrupt reductions and dragged in with irresistible slaughter of prices before he will spend a cent.

THE Fossil Journal says "the coyote bounty of \$2 is working almost to perfection so far in Gilliam, and these pests are being rapidly thinned out of the county." 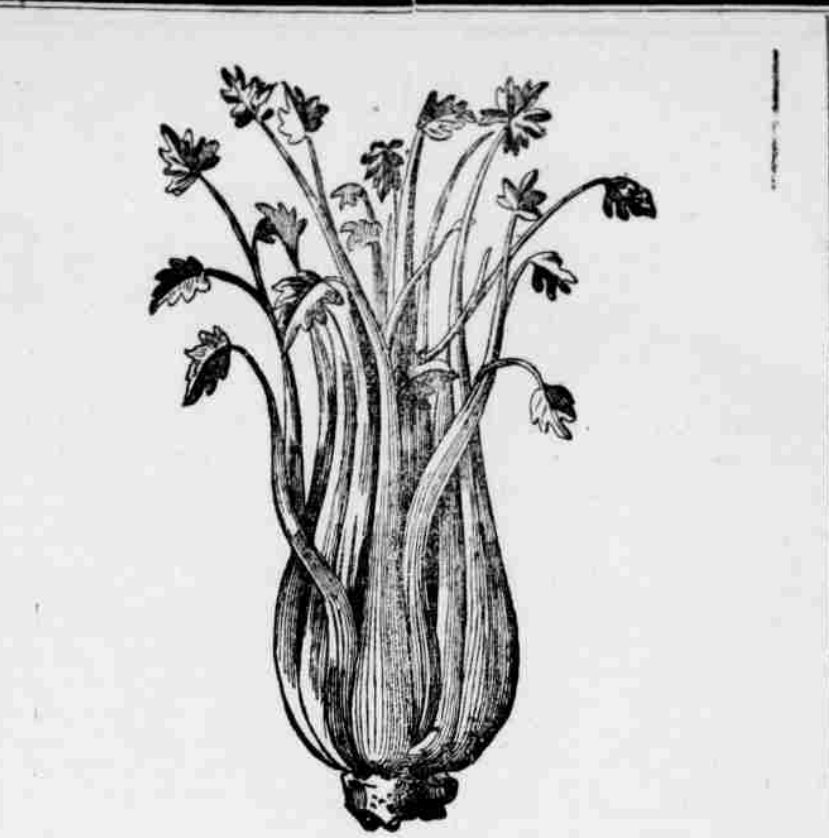

DIGEST OF LAND AND MINING DECISIONS. FURNISHED BY W. D. HARLAN, LAND AND MINING ATTORNEY, WASHINGTON, D. C. AGRICULTURAL. Settlers who, without authority of law, enter upon lands that are held in reservation under departmental instructions that expressly forbid all settlers from entering thereon, until lawful permission is given, acquire no equities thereby. COAL. A private entry of coal land, may not be allowed to embrace one tract, taken in the capacity of an assignee, and another under the individual right of the purchaser. MINERAL. A placer location made prior to the act of August 4, 1892, of land chiefly valuable for a deposit of glass sand and building stone is not a legal appropriation of the land, and the subsequent intervening homestead entry of another will defeat the placer application.
