A SAD ENDING. The Death of John Allison Strayer Recalls to Mind Events of the Past—A Cousin of Senator Allison of Iowa. Strayer's full name was John Allison Strayer, and at the time of his death must have been about 50 years of age. He was born in Pennsylvania and reared in Ashland county, Ohio. His playmate in boyhood days was the boy who now is known as Senator Wm. B. Allison, a full cousin of Strayer, their mothers being sisters. This is the "Bill" that Strayer used to mention in his ravings while intoxicated. Strayer served through the late war, and afterwards became quite a power in politics in his locality in Ohio. He had a fine family, was well-to-do, and no one was more highly respected. About twenty-five years ago he was kicked by a horse and dangerously hurt, but he recovered apparently, though his friends and family say that his mind never was right afterwards. Having been a moderate drinker for years, he sought to drown his imaginary troubles in the cup and became an inebriate. His property went with the winds, his wife died with a broken heart, his family became scattered and Strayer came to the Pacific coast where he lived most of the time for the past eighteen or twenty years. Strayer's death ends what might have been a useful life. In his younger days he was considered to be as bright a man as his cousin who has mounted many a round on the ladder of fame. One was master of himself; the other was not.

DIGEST OF LAND AND MINING DECISIONS. Furnished by W. D. Harlan, land and mining attorney, Washington, D. C. Sale of improvements is evidence of abandonment. Charge of abandonment should be specific. An Alien can acquire no right to public land before declaration of intention to become a citizen, and his subsequent qualification will not relate back to the exclusion of an intervening adverse right. The execution of a power of attorney to sell does not constitute alienation of title.

NINE DEMANDS OF LIBERALISM. 1. I demand that churches and other ecclesiastical property shall be no longer exempt from just taxation. 2. I demand that the employment of chaplains in congress, in state legislatures in the navy and militia, and in prisons, asylums, and in all other institutions supported by public money, be discontinued. 3. DEBENT. In the absence of an adverse claim, an entry made in good faith will not be canceled although it includes non-irrigable land. COAL. Proof as to character of coal land must show the actual production of mineral. Proof that adjoining lands have produced coal will not answer. MILL SITE. Mill-site location must be made as a mineral claim. Non-mineral character of land claimed as a mill-site must be shown. MINERAL. Failure to comply with local regulations is matter for protest or adverse suit. A hearing may be ordered to determine whether there has been due compliance with law, though the charge is not made until after entry.
