Bequests of hearts have been by no means uncommon. Richard Cœur de Leon bequeathed his heart to the canons of Rouen cathedral, and in July, 1838, this remarkable relie was once again brought to light after the lapse of six centuries; the heart, which is said to have been surprisingly large, says Temple Bar, was inclosed in boxes of lead and silver, and withered, as it was described, to the semblance of a faded leaf.
