Advices upon the subject have been received from all parts of the world by the authorities of the marine hospital service, and Dr. Wyman believes that if there ever was any ground for fear, St. Paul Kansas City there is not now the least. During the present year, and up to

this time, cholera has existed in European Russian, Arabia, India, China and Japan. It is unfortunate that trustworthy statistics concerning it cannot be obtained from Russia, or from any of the other countries in which it exists, with the exception of Japan. It ravaged several of the western Russian provinces last summer; it did not entirely disappear last winter, and it has been epidemic since the early spring season. During the month of July it has prevailed largely in the provinces of Volhynia and Podolia. near the territory of Austria, and, also, to some extent, in the Vistula provinces, on the confines of Prussia. It is said to be of an unusually malignant type, and its victims are speedily carried off. In order to keep it out of Germany, the Berlin government has established a "sanitary cordon" along the frontier, and all travelers from Russia are again this year, as they were last year, subjected to a most rig orous inspection. Austria also has made some provision for guarding the border, but it is much less complete than that made by Germany, and there have been many cases of the disease in Galicia and Bukowina.

In the dispatches there are ocasional references to its exisience in he Liao-Tong peninsula and in the ingdom of Corea, and there is every reman to believed that it has been very destructive in these regions. It was by the Japanese soldiers returning home from the Liao-Tong peninsula that it was introduced into Japan a few months ago.

From the trustworthy statistics that are kept by the Japanese authorities, it s learned that up to the close of July there had been nine thousand five hundred cases of the disease in Japan, more than one-half of which had proved fatal. RAVAGES OF GRAIN SMUTS.

Means of Prevention Outlined by the Agricultural College.

The ravages of the grain smuts are

reviewed and the means of prevention outlined in a report of the agricultural department. The oat smut, which is found throughout the United States and is known on every continent, probably has the widest distribution of any of the species. The official estimate of the direct loss from it is eight per cent. of the crop, or about eighteen million dollars annually. Stinking smuts in wheatfields cost the country many millions of dollars annually. Sometimes fifty or seventy-live per cent. of the heads are smutted and the sound grain is so contaminated with the fetid spores. as to be nearly worthless for flour and worse than useress for seed. The disease is often apread from farm to farm by thrushing machines. When once introduced, if left unchecked it increases year by year until a large percentage of the crop is destroyed. The loose amut usually causes a loss of ten per cent. or more of the wheat crop, and has even been reported as destroying over fifty per cent. of a crop in Michigan. It is very difficult to prevent, and ordinary treatment has little effect. Wheat growers are urged to try to secure seed wheat from fields known by careful examination at flouring time to be free from loose smut.
