ELECTING SENATORS.

For years past there been a popular demand for the election of U.S. senators by the direct vote of the people, though such a measure has never received a warm support from the senators themselves. However, there are exceptions, and among them is our own Senator Mitchell who recently introduced the following resolu-

"Resolved by the senate and house of representatives of the United States of America in congress assembled (two-thirds of the house concurring therein), that the following amendment to the constitution of the United States be proposed to the legislatures of the several states, which, when ratified by three-fourths of said legislatures shall be known as the sixteenth amendment:

"That the senate of the United States shall be composed of two senators from each state who shall be chosen by a direct vote of the several states for six years; and the electors in each state shall have the qualifications requisite for electors of the most numerous branch of the state legislature; and each senator shall have one vote and
