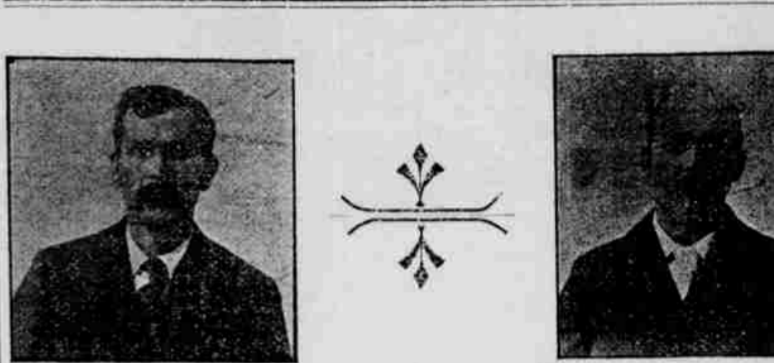

ORDER FOR PUBLICATION. In the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Morrow County. Plaintiff, J. W. Morrow County Clerk of said Morrow County, Oregon, and the heirs of Charles Lind, deceased. Defendant, J. W. Morrow, generally, and the heirs of said Morrow, deceased. Wherein, it has been satisfactorily made to appear to the Court that on the 12th day of January, 1906, in said Morrow County, Oregon, one Charles Lind died intestate, that at the time of his death said Charles Lind was unmarried and left no children, or other heirs at law, and that up to the time of the commencement of this proceeding no person or persons have appeared claiming to be an heir, or heirs, of said deceased. That at the time of his death as aforesaid, said deceased was seized of certain real estate in said Morrow County, Oregon, of considerable amount of personal property, that after said death the County Court of Morrow County duly appointed administrator of the estate of said deceased, who duly qualified and entered upon said trust, and proceeded to administer said estate, under the direction of said County Court.
