Democratic County Convention.
 A democratic county convention for the county of Morrow, state of Oregon, is called to meet in Heppner, on Saturday, April 4, 1896, at 10 o'clock a. m., for the purpose of nominating candidates for the following county officers: One county judge, county commissioner, county clerk, county sheriff, county representative, county treasurer, county assessor, county school superintendent, county coroner and county surveyor, and also precinct officers for the several precincts, and four delegates each to the state and second district congressional convention, and to transact such other business as may properly come before such convention. The convention will consist of 23 delegates, chosen by the several precincts; and the several precincts of the county will be entitled to representation in said convention as follows: Heppner 4 Eight Mile 2 Geary 4 Alpine 2 Mt. Vernon 3 Pine City 2 Lost 2 Matteson 2 Cecil 2 Lexington 2 Dairy 2 Wells Springs 2 Dry Fork 2 Lena 2

The same being one delegate at-large from each precinct, and one delegate for every fifteen votes, and one for every fraction over one-half of fifteen votes cast for J. H. Haley, the democratic candidate for congressman, at the election in June, 1894.

Primaries to elect the delegates in each of the several precincts will be held March 28, 1896. Polls will be open at 2 o'clock a. m., and will be conducted in the usual manner of holding primary elections.
