





to Scratching Required this Year. - 1 oters

A good deal of mquiry is made these days as to how the voting at the June polls will be conducted. Voters who thought the ballot given them two years ago was large will have something to kick about in the shape of size this time because of the addition of new tickets and a large number of candidates for each office in the county, city and dis-

triet.

Daily the county clerk gives out information on this score until he is dejected and weary.

Electors this year will not be required to scratch several hundred names of candidates that they do not want to vote for. This was the bother last election, as it took a voter a long time to select bis candidate under each office and scratch out the names of the others. It made the tickets look as if they had been half mutilated. The difference now is that the elector puts a mark opposite the name of the man he does vote for, and that is all that is required

If he votes a mixed ticket all that is necessary to do is to place a mark immedistely to the left of the caodidate he desires to be elected. The Oregon Australian ballot law has been called a misnomer, and so it is. Until it is changed to include all the provisions of the Australian system, as it should be, it is far from being either satisfactory

or right. Only a short time remains yet for the independent candidates to get themselves placed on the ticket. The independent or disconnected candidates can file adminstions up to within 15 days of election. Not later than this the clerk of the county court is directed by the law to prepare the sample and the white ballots for printing, and place the names on the ticket

Following are extracts from the law in

regard to voting:
Section 59. On receipt of his white ballot as aforesaid, the elector shall forthwith and without leaving the inclosed space, retire slone to one of the compartments or places provided, and shall there prepare his ballot by marking immediately to the left of the name of the candidate of his choice for each office to be filled, or by writing in the name of the person he wishes to vote for; and, in case of a constitutional amendment or other question submitted to the vote of the people, by marking to the left of the answer he desires to make, which shall be done with as indelible "copying" pencil, or with pen and ink. Before leaving the compartment, or place provided, the elector shall fold his ballot so that the face thereof will be concealed, without displaying the ballot or informing any person how he has prepared it; and he shall fold the callot so that the remaining stub may be readily torn off without exposing the contents of the ballot or the marks or crosses thereon. He shall then deliver the ballot to the chairman, and state his name and residence.

Section 66. Any elector who declares to the chairman that he cannot read or write, or that by blindness, or other physical disability, he is unable to pre-pare his ballot, shall, upon request, re-ceive the assistance of two of the judges in the preparation thereof, and such officers shall ascertain his wishes and prepare his ballot in accordance therewith, and such officers shall thereafter give no information regarding the same. The chairman may, in his discretion, request such declaration of disability to be made by the elector under oath. Whenever an elector receives assistance in this manner, the second clerk shall write upon the polibook, opposite the name of the elector, the word "Assisted," and if sworp, also "Sworp." In preparing his ballot, any elector shall be at liberty to use or copy any colored or sample ballot provided by this act which he may choose to mark or to have had

he may choose to mark or to have had marked in advance, to assist him in marking the official ballot.

In regard to penalties for violations of the election laws, section 67 says a fine of from \$50 to \$100 shall be imposed for misconduct on the part of the voter. For conviction of the part of the voter. conviction of misconduct on the part of the officers conducting the polls impris-onment from three months to one year or a fine of from \$50 to \$500—or both, in the discretion of the court-is the penalty. A penalty of from one to three years in the penitentiary or a fine from \$500 to \$1000, or both, is imposed for the practice of fraud by the judges or






