It has been rumored that A. W. Patterson was instrumental in the passage of the deputy salary bill for clerk and sheriff of this county. I will say that Mr. Patterson never spoke to me about the matter, and had nothing to do with it in any way, so far as my knowledge goes.

BURNS, Oregon, May 5, 1896. To the voters of Morrow county:

In the hope of setting at rest untrue and idle rumors, which are being circulated in your county, I desire to make a brief statement to the end that no injustice shall be done anyone.

I refer especially to the legislative act approved Feb. 25, 1895, "To change the compensation and mode of payment of county clerks, sheriffs and other officers, and also to provide for the appointment of deputies." See session laws, 1895, page 77.

As to any person lobbying, or using any influence for or against the measure, or to get it "fixed up" with a view of personal benefit, I can state that no one approached me on the subject, nor did I hear of any member being importuned. It seemed to have been settled by the sentiment of the people that such offices and deputies should be placed on a salary, and it was also understood by the members, as a quiet undercurrent, that the serving incumbents were opposed to the measure...

A CARD. There are reports in circulation that if I am elected sheriff that I will close men out for their tax. To all such I will promise to be as lenient as the county court will permit me.

SECOND DAY—Wednesday, May 27—Race 3. Three and one-half furlongs, free for all. Purses, \$75. Race 4. Half mile dash, free for all. Purses, \$100.

THIRD DAY—Thursday, May 28—Race 5. One thousand yards, free for all. Purses, \$100. Race 6. Three-eighths mile, handicap, repeat, free for all. Purses, \$100.
