But really, in successful launches, the stern of the vessel is gradually lifted up by the water, and this throws the weight

forward on that part of the ship still resting on the ways. The force of the water is called the "moment of buoyaney," and the natural tendency of the ship to drop to the bottom of the stream is called the "moment of weight," Now the moment of buoyancy must always be greater than the moment of weight; but it must not be very much greater, for if it were it would throw too much weight forward on the part of the ship still on the ways, and might break them down, or injure the plates or keel of the ship. 
