POKER AN INDEX OF INSANITY.
Forgetting to Ante Urged as Ground for Breaking a Will.

During the contest over the will of John B. Haskin, who was known in politics as "Tuscarora" Haskin, one of the witnesses gave testimony to show that failure to properly play the game of poker is an evidence of insanity, says a New York dispatch in the Providence Journal. Mr. Haskin left an estate valued at over \$1,000,000, most of which he bequeathed to his son. His daughter and grandchild contested the will. Benjamin F. Cohn said Mr. Haskin was very fond of poker and was a very careful player until the spring of 1892, when he became careless, often holding his cards so that the other players could see them.
