A PIONEER OF 1844 GONE.
Mrs. Elizabeth Conser Passed Away Saturday at 5:30 o'clock P. M.—Neuralgia of the Stomach Producing Heart Failure.

Mrs. Elizabeth Conser died very suddenly at her home, corner of Sixth and Lawrence streets, at 5:30 o'clock last Saturday evening; cause of death, neuralgia of the heart, caused by old age and stomach trouble.
Mrs. Elizabeth Felix Conser was born in Indiana, April 13, 1825, and was therefore nearly 73 years of age at the time of her death.
She crossed the plains with the emigrant train of 1844; spent the winter in the Spokane country with the family of the sainted missionary, Rev. J. H. Spaulding. While crossing the plains she met and formed the acquaintance of one of the members of that train, Mr. Norris Humphrey. This acquaintance ripened into more than friendship. Mr. Humphrey located a donation land claim near Jefferson in '44, and in the spring of '45 he sought the home of Rev. Mr. Spaulding where his fiancée was residing. They were united in marriage by Mr. Spaulding and immediately returned to Mr. Humphrey's home near Jefferson. In '49 Mr. Humphrey went to the California gold fields. Returning a year later he conducted a store in Jefferson for two years and then with his family moved to Eugene, where he lived till the time of his death, which occurred in Feb. 1879.
It May 1881 Mrs. Humphrey and Mr. Jacob Conser were married. Mr. Conser was a pioneer of 1848; served in the territorial legislature in 1849 and in several subsequent terms. He died March 20, 1893.
Since Mr. Conser's death Mrs. Conser has remained at her home in Eugene, enjoying the company of her niece or some other relative, and spending much of her time with her life long friend, Mrs. Wesley Shannon.
Last Thursday Mrs. Conser began feeling ill, and that night a doctor was called. She seemed to suffer with a slight stomach trouble but was thought to be recovering from the attack. On Friday and Saturday she was able to receive calls from her friends and gave evidence of improvement. About 5:30 o'clock Saturday afternoon she suddenly complained of nausea, and after a slight vomiting spell, she fell back on a pillow gasping for breath. A physician and Mrs. Shannon were hastily summoned, but long before they arrived, Mrs. Conser had quietly and peacefully breathed her last.
Mrs. Conser leaves a sister, Mrs. Sarah Perkins, aged 83 years, residing at North Yamhill, and a niece, Mrs. Myrtle Warren of Goshen, Lane county, besides two brothers and one sister in Indiana. She also leaves the following step children: Shannon Conser, of Portland; John and Henry Conser, of Albany; George Conser, of Heppner; Hope Conser, Jefferson; Louis Conser, of Portland; Mrs. Phoebe Watson, of Washington; and Mrs. R. O. Thomas, of Turner.
A large number of her relatives, besides a host of friends attended the funeral, which was held at the family residence at 2:30 o'clock this afternoon, after which the remains were interred in the A. F. & A. M. cemetery, Rev. R. C. Brooks, of the first Congregational church, officiating.
Thus has passed to her final reward another faithful, kind-hearted, highly esteemed pioneer, whose life was constantly devoted to labors of charity and love. All who knew Mrs. Conser recognized in her life the highest and noblest of principles vouchsafed unto mankind. When her friends rejoiced, she, too, was glad; when sorrow came, her words of sympathy and acts of kindness were ever cherished. Liberal, kind-hearted and generous, she accomplished much good during her lifetime, and her friends and neighbors suffer an irreparable loss by her sudden death. But the lessons of kindness, patience, charity and love so foretely taught by this noble lady, will long live in the hearts and lives of those with whom she came in contact. Though dead, she yet speaketh.

COTTON AND TOBACCO
Seed will be distributed in Eastern Oregon by the O. R. & N.
Five hundred pounds of cotton seed, the first installment for the O. R. & N. Co.'s industrial department, have arrived in Portland from Texas, says the Oregonian. The seed will be sent out for experimental planting in Umatilla and other counties of Oregon and Washington where the conditions seem favorable and where there will be assurance of careful treatment. The planting time for this cotton seed is in April.
Tobacco seed has been sent for and it will arrive in a few days. This seed will be planted as soon as it shall be obtainable, in hotbeds or boxes that can be protected from possible frost. The plants will be transplanted in the fields when all danger of frost shall have past. Experiments in tobacco culture, like those of cotton raising, will be under the supervision of agents of the O. R. & N. Co., though in a few cases careful and responsible farmers may be supplied with seed for experiment. The object is to gain reliable knowledge from these experiments and not to trust to miscellaneous guess work.

Cattle for the Klondike. W. M. Rudio, of Long Creek, well known in Pendleton, merchant as well as stock raiser, is said to be preparing to take a large outfit from Grant county to the gold fields of Alaska, says the E. O. He will take between 100 and 500 4 and 5 year old steers. A large number of his cattle are now being fed in Fox valley, and he expects to start about May 1. Mr. Rudio will leave about February 1 to make arrangements for the transportation of his stock and outfit. He has not reached any decision as to what point they will be shipped from. His intention is to land at Pyramid point and drive the cattle from there to Fort Selkirk, over the Dalton trail. He will take with him not less than 15 men, all practical packers, and thorough cowmen, and about 50 pack horses. He estimates that the outfit landed in Alaska will cost him not less than \$25,000.
