A Washington Sheepman Makes a Good Sale of Scoured Wool at Pendleton.

From the E. O. John McGregor, who shipped his wool down to the scouring mill at Pendleton, where he held it in storage, visited this city Thursday, and closed the sale of his scoured wool to Allen & Lewis, of San Francisco, at 47 cents per pound. This netted him about the highest price obtained for any heavy wools shipped to Pendleton this season.

Mr. McGregor is a large sheepowner of Eastern Washington, running between twelve and fifteen thousand head. He expresses himself as so well pleased with the result of his experiment at Pendleton's scouring mill that he will hereafter do his business in this city. He has been able to offer his wool for sale in different markets, east and west, by means of samples, and has thus obtained the advantage of competitive bidding.

The price realized by Mr. McGregor for his wool in the grease was over nine cents per pound, which considering the fact that it belonged to a class of exceptionally heavy Washington wools is a very gratifying figure.
