### THE DEAL CLOSED.

The W. & C. R. R. Will Become a Part of the Northern Pacific on March 1st.

General Manager Piers, Land Agent Cooper and other officials of the Northern Pacific were at Hunt's Junction Sunday, but did not come to Pendleton on the trip of inspection, as expected, says the E. O. They rode out a mile or two this side of Hunt's and then returned to the Junction.

The entire W. & C. R. R. system has been purchased by the Northern Pacific company, which is the reason its officials are out touring the roads. It is expected that the purchase company will take charge of its new property by the 1st of the month.

The W. & C. R. R., commonly known as the "Hunt Line," consists of 164 miles of road tapping a rich strip of country. It is supposed the Northern Pacific paid a pretty stiff figure for its small neighbor, the possession of which it has long desired.

### NOVEL ADVERTISING DEVICE.

Incandescent Globes Used for Eyes in a Stuffed State Street Animal.

A State street fur dealer has evolved a striking novelty for advertising both his goods and his place. He has a number of stuffed animals which he has mounted himself in various portions of the shop. A white polar bear, a lion, two leopards and other smaller animals are seen in various positions. In the show window are two lynxes and a Rocky mountain lion, says the Chicago Chronicle.

Every night at dusk when the store is lit up each of these animals is seen looking at you with blazing eyes. The lion's yellow eyeballs literally glow with fire. Crowds invariably stop in front of the shop to look at the lynxes' sparkling emerald eyes, and as that portion of the show window is invariably kept darker than the rest of the store the effect from the outside looks peculiarly weird and odd.

"There is no secret about it," said he the other day to an inquisitive caller. "Insulated wires have been run up through the creature's frames and the eyeballs of different colors that you see are simply small incandescent globes that I had made to order. The wires are connected with the service in the store and when the current is turned on, why, they too are lit. No, the idea is not original with me. While in London last summer I saw the thing done in a Piccadilly shop. I thought it was a clever device, and I followed the suggestion."
