TOOTH DRAWING.
Its Horrors Ameliorated Somewhat by the Use of Electricity.
If you like you can now have a tooth pulled painlessly and without gas by electricity. Instantaneous? Why, of course; but the point is that there is no pain. You need not bother with nitrous-oxide gas, which is very distressing in its effects upon some people, says the Cincinnati Enquirer.
The up-to-date dentist has a very simple apparatus, which consists most importantly of a battery not much bigger than a cigar box. The person in the dentist's chair grasps two handles which are connected with the battery by wires. At the same time the operator seizes his forceps, which likewise are on the end of a wire proceeding from the battery. He touches the tooth completing the circuit, and instantly a local anaesthesia is produced. The tooth and neighboring gum are rendered for the moment insensible to pain, and out comes the offending molar or incisor with a dexterous twist. Before the patient has had time to realize what has happened he is gleefully paying the fee.

SOLID GOLD TOILET SET.
Property of the Khedive Inherited with Precious Stones.
It is said that the only complete gold toilet set in the world belongs to the Khedive of Egypt. Its exact value is not known, but it must be enormous, for the set is encrusted with diamonds and other precious stones. Egypt, by the way, has a debt of about \$225,000,000, and besides the interest on this has to pay an annual tribute to the sultan of Turkey amounting to nearly \$3,500,000. Despite this the present Khedive has been following in the footsteps of his predecessors, whose extravagances brought about the present almost bankrupt condition of the country.
Each piece of the Khedive's golden toilet set bears his monogram in diamonds. Upward of 3,000 diamonds and over 1,200 rubies were used in decorating these gorgeous adjuncts to the Egyptian ruler's dressing-table. The body of each of the 25 pieces is of 18-karat gold, and all are enclosed in a diamond-encrusted ebony case.

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FEMINE SUICIDES.
Women Take Poison Where Men Shoot Themselves.
Statistical tables yield curious information to the careful student, says the Philadelphia Times. For instance, they show that over one-third of the women who kill themselves are not yet 25 years of age. They show that women take poison, where men shoot themselves, and they show that the poor, sick and the infirm are not by any kind of reckoning in the majority. A physician who makes a study of attempted suicide said this:
"Get a girl past 25 and she'll go through poverty, sickness and desertion and misery enough to kill ten men. The more people suffer the more they cling to life. I've seen it in the hospitals. It is not the patients with the incurable diseases or the hopeless cripples who beg to die, but the young, strong, vital woman, who hates pain and doesn't want to suffer it, even for the chance of getting well. It is a strange thing, this getting of a girl past 25, but not uncommon. Any physician with a large family practice will tell you of a dozen cases in his own circle of knowledge. Sometimes it is called pyromania, sometimes kleptomania, sometimes catatonia, sometimes hysteria, sometimes feigning and sometimes truntrum—it's all the same thing—nothing else to do."
Another physician told of a girl who committed suicide and who left a note stating that her reason was that she was tired of doing the same things over and over every day. The monotony of life had become unbearable to her.

END OF THE CHESAPEAKE.
The Old Man-of-War Turned Into a Flour
An English journal contains the following item:
"It is not by any means widely known that the Chesapeake, famous for her historic encounter with the British ship Channon in 1813, is in existence today, but is used in the somewhat inglorious capacity of a flour mill, and is making money for a hearty Hampshire miller in the little parish of Wickham. After her capture by Sir Philip B. V. Broke she was taken to England in 1814, and in 1820 her timbers were sold to Mr. John Prior, miller, of Wickham. Mr. Prior pulled down his own mill at Wickham and erected a new one from the Chesapeake timbers, which he found admirably adapted for the purpose. The deck beams were 32 feet long, and served, without alteration, for joists. Many of these timbers yet bear the marks of the Shannon grape-shot, and in some places the shot are still to be seen deeply imbedded in the pitch pine. The metamorphosis of a man-of-war into a peaceful life-sustaining flour mill is, perhaps, as near an approach to the prophecy that speaks of swords shall be beaten into plows and pruning hooks, as the conditions of modern civilization will allow."

Andrew J. Keeney.
From the Guard, Eugene, March 5th.
—At his residence one-half mile east of Goshen, Uncle Jack Keeney quietly passed away yesterday at the advanced age of 78 years, 4 months and 25 days. His demise is due to kidney trouble, and the complaint has extended over a period of several years, gradually weakening his strong constitution.
Decided in his friendships, with a sincere nature, Uncle Jack had hosts of warm personal friends, who will learn of his demise with sincere regret.
The funeral services will be held from his late residence at 10 o'clock tomorrow (Sunday) morning, the interment taking place in the Keeney cemetery, Cloverdale. Rev. J. T. Abbot, pastor of the M. E. church of this city, will conduct the services.

[Andrew J. Keeney was born in La Fayette county, Missouri, October 7, 1821, but when an infant was taken to Ray county, in the same state, by his parents. At the age of 21 years he moved to the northern part of Missouri and 12 months later proceeded to Holt county, purchased a farm and engaged in agricultural pursuits. In 1850 he crossed the plains to California, but 18 months thereafter returned to Missouri, taking up his residence there until May, 1857. At this time, with his wife and four children he once more essayed the journey across the plains, but on this occasion, to Oregon, where he arrived October 5, 1857. Having made the trip by way of California, he there disposed of his teams, took passage by sea to Portland, where he remained but a short time, and then came direct to Lane county, purchased a farm comprising 640 acres, the Milton Riggs donation claim, to which he has since added 202 acres, making his estate a compact tract of 842 acres. Mr. Keeney's residence was situated about half a mile east of Goshen on the Central Military road, where he was engaged for years in general farming and stock-raising. Married in the first instance in Clinton, Henry county, Missouri, Miss Elizabeth Mulholland, by which union they had one child, now deceased. He espoused, secondly, Mrs. Cooper, in Atchison county, Missouri, and had four children, three of whom survive, viz: James M. William D. and John B. Thirdly he took unto himself a wife, Mrs. A. J. Mathews, and had four children, viz: Martha E. Benjamin F. Andrew A. and Thomas P. J.
Mr. Keeney was the stepfather of Mrs. J. W. Matlock of Heppner, and a pioneer of Oregon, highly respected in the community in which he lived.
