Army and Navy to Co-Operate at Once. WASHINGTON, April 21.—The cabinet at a meeting this afternoon discussed a number of questions all of which involve immediate hostilities. The question of war was considered, but it is understood it is unlikely that any formal declaration will be made at once.

The Text of the President's Ultimatum. WASHINGTON, April 21.—Following is the text of the President's ultimatum to Spain, as given out this morning: "April 20, 1898.—Woodford, minister of the United States, Madrid: You have been furnished with the text of the joint resolution voted by the congress of the United States on the 19th inst., and approved today in relation to the pacification of the island of Cuba."

Minister Woodford Receives Passports. WASHINGTON, April 21.—The following statement regarding the sending of the ultimatum to Spain was issued today: On yesterday, April 20, 1898, at 11 o'clock, the department of state served notice of the purposes of this government, by delivering to Minister Polo a copy of the instructions to Minister Woodford and also a copy of the resolutions passed by the congress of the United States on the 19th.
