### FALLING MOUNTAINS.

#### One Theory for the Recent Earthquake in Japan.

Advises from Yokohama by steamship say that Mr. Iguchi, director of Gift observatory, has been examining the district where the shock was most severe. At this place some years ago holes appeared in the ground to which no bottom could be found, and it was believed they communicated with immense cavities far below. Mr. Iguchi now believes the earthquake was caused by the Fujiki mountains slipping into these caverns. In the district of Ono an immense landslide took place, damming Mano river. A lake is now forming, which is already fifty feet deep. Another large lake is being formed in the same way by the Ashiba river at Nagoya. The earthquake was still going November 9, seven hundred and thirty shocks being felt in the twenty preceding hours. This is more than two per minute. The great want in the earthquake regions is shelter. There is sufficient food to prevent actual starvation, but over four hundred thousand people are homeless, with almost no clothing. Winter is rapidly approaching and the suffering will be very great. A section of about thirty miles on the railroad from Tokio to Kijato was so much damaged that it will probably have to be entirely rebuilt. A curious fact is that an anonymous writer sent a letter to the cabinet two months ago announcing a national calamity would take place October 28. This was the very day of the earthquake. The letter is preserved in the government archives.

### DOGS ON MONEY.

The Canines of Different Nations Shown on Their Coins.

There is an important group of about forty coins containing outlines of dogs, which deserve careful study. The interest of some of them, says Chambers' Journal, is mainly mythical, as with Lalapas, the hound of Actaeon, presented to Cephalus by Proeris; or with the dog of Sogeste, which symbolized the river Crimissus. But there are enough to show how extensive were the operations of the dog fancier in early times. The coins afford no evidence of the development of a spaniel, there being no example of a pendulous ear, or of a mastiff, though bulldogs were undoubtedly known in the arenas of imperial Rome. But they prove conclusively—that the ancients had four kinds of dogs—the wolf dog, the hound, the greyhound and the terrier. The Umbrians had their wolf hounds, the Apulians, of Aesculapius, their greyhounds, the more rugged hunters of the Tuscan forests, their fox dogs. The favorite dog of Artemis Laphria, as on coins of Patras and Sparta, was a greyhound, while Actaeon's dogs must have been half-bred deerhounds. Rhegium, if the coins may be trusted, had his sheep dogs; the Macedonian city of Mendis its terriers, and Carthage, just above the bay of Naples, which had the luxuries of the ancient world were brought, its poodles. Further pursuit of this line of inquiry would probably throw some useful light upon the direction of canine domestication.
