WAR NEWS!

CAPE HAITEN, June 3.—An American auxiliary ship tried to run over the torpedo defences at Santiago harbor but was burned up and sunk immediately.

CAPE HAITEN, June 4.—The Merrimac, a collier, was sent into the narrow entrance leading to the bay of Santiago de Cuba.

LONDON, June 4.—According to Herald, a Madrid newspaper the bottling up of Cervera's squadron at Santiago shows that Spain has been led on the straight road to perdition.

KINGSTON, Jamaica, June 4.—Information that the Cadiz squadron is in the vicinity of Cuba comes from an English source, and appears trustworthy.

WASHINGTON, June 4.—The senate has agreed to the three hundred million bonds. It has also agreed to coin \$42,000,000 of silver per month out of the seigniorage in the treasury at present.

CAPE HAITEN, June 4.—It is reported here that the Americans destroyed the Spanish fleet at Santiago yesterday, but the report has not been confirmed.

WASHINGTON, D. C., June 5.—Admiral Cervera sent his chief of staff under a flag of truce to tell of the safety of the heroes of the Merrimac.

NEW YORK, June 6.—The hospital ship Solace, from Key West, arrived with 54 wounded and sick from the squadron off the coast of Cuba.

CAPE HAITEN, June 6.—The American warship, Mayflower, arrived at Mole St. Nicholas, conveying troop ships with troops and ammunition for Santiago de Cuba.

LONDON, June 6.—All English papers applaud the daring feat of Holson taking the Merrimac into Santiago, completely bottling up the Spanish squadron in that port.

CAPE HAITEN, June 6.—Advice from St. Nicholas says that Saturday, off Jean Robble, northwest corner of Hayti combat took place between three Spanish and four American warships.

MADRID, June 6.—Three Spanish cruisers and three other protected vessels have been seen off the island of Madagascar.

WASHINGTON, June 6.—The report from Antonio confirms the reported sinking of the Spanish torpedo boat Terror by our glorious battleship Oregon, which fired only one 13-inch shell into it.

MANILA, June 6.—A Spanish outpost has been attacked by insurgents. Over 1000 Spaniards were killed. The fight lasted 70 hours.

WASHINGTON, June 6.—At daylight Monday the American troops landed a few miles east of Santiago de Cuba, under cover of Sampson's guns.

SANTIAGO DE CUBA, June 6.—Under a flag of truce a Spanish captain visited Sampson to congratulate him on the bravery of the Merrimac's crew.
