

CAPE HAITEN, June 3 .- An American auxillary ship tried to run over the torpedo defences at Santiago harbor but was burned up and sunk immediately. One officer, six seamen and one engineer were made prisoners.

CAPE HAITEN, June 4.—The Merrimac, a collier, was sent into the narrow entrance leading to the bay of Santiago de Cuba. A sudden explosion occurred and the vessel sank immediately in the channel.
